# Introduction

During the past few years, an ambitious economic reform program has been implemented in Egypt. Its main pillars aimed at achieving stability in macroeconomic indicators and carrying out structural reforms in the investment environment. This was accomplished by applying unprecedented improvements and advances in the system of legislation and procedures related to the investment climate. This was combined with the implementation of mega national projects that pave the way for providing promising investment opportunities in various sectors. This would enable Egypt to occupy a top position in the list of the most attractive countries for foreign direct investment (FDI) in the Middle East and Africa.

The General Authority for Investment and Free Zones (GAFI) seeks to increase domestic investments and attract more FDI by applying an integrated package of procedures, which aim at putting into effect the investment law that provides a set of guarantees and general and special incentives. The government is currently scaling up investment incentives to the domestic and foreign private sectors by providing special incentives stipulated in the investment law to projects in a number of sectors. Moreover, the government provides a package of green incentives and other incentives to investments in the health sector and new cities. In the same connection, it adopts the comprehensive approval approach (Golden License) process.

GAFI sustains its efforts to improve services provided by Investor Service Centers through the application of “Digital Transformation System” and finalization of service automation in these centers. Accordingly, service time to incorporate a company has been shortened to one business day, in addition to issuing approvals, permits and licenses in twenty business days as of the date of submitting the application and all necessary documents in coordination with all concerned entities, and working to reduce this period to 10 business days.

Furthermore, GAFI seeks to develop channels of communication with the business community to discuss all proposals related to the growth of investment, improvement of business environment and coordination with major international companies. Accordingly, the latter will be encouraged to establish new projects or expand existing ones. in Egypt. GAFI presents the investment opportunities available in various economic sectors by updating Egypt's investment map.

Through the implementation of the aforementioned pillars, GAFI aims to maximize the private sector's participation in economic development. This is part of the State's current plan, which targets to take the private investments' contribution to the implemented investments up to 65 percent of total investments during the next three years.

In this report, GAFI highlights the advantages and potentials of investment in Egypt, especially given the economic developments in Egypt during the past few years since implementation of the economic reform program, whose positive results have succeeded in mitigating the negative impact of repercussions of the Covid-19 pandemic and Russian-Ukrainian crisis. The report also presents main legislative amendments and procedures adopted to streamline measures for all investors, the leading economic sectors and mega national projects on which the State is focusing to promote investment opportunities.



# Pillar I

Competitive Advantages and Potentials to Invest in Egypt



## 1. Adopting a Full-fledged Reform Program to Realize Development

The Egyptian government seeks to enhance the flexibility and diversification of the Egyptian economy, increase its productivity, and achieve comprehensive and sustainable growth. In this context, Egypt began in November 2016 to implement a comprehensive national program for economic and social reform, the first stage aimed at achieving the economic reform, followed by a program of structural reforms as a second stage to ensure activating and sustaining the gains of the first phase of the Program.

Egypt has succeeded in completing the first phase of the economic reform program, through focusing on reforming fiscal and monetary policies, studying and addressing the challenges that the Egyptian economy was suffering from. This contributed to restoring the stability and balance of the country's macro economy, and achieving positive results and indicator according to many international institutions.

### Economic Reform Program Goals (Phase One)

#### Achieving stability in macroeconomic indicators



Liberalizing exchange rates with the aim of eliminating the parallel market and ending the state of turmoil in foreign-exchange markets.



Reforming the subsidy system.



Issuing the value-added tax law.

Bringing the inflation rate to low and stable levels.

Promoting local and foreign investments, and providing a more favorable investment environment.

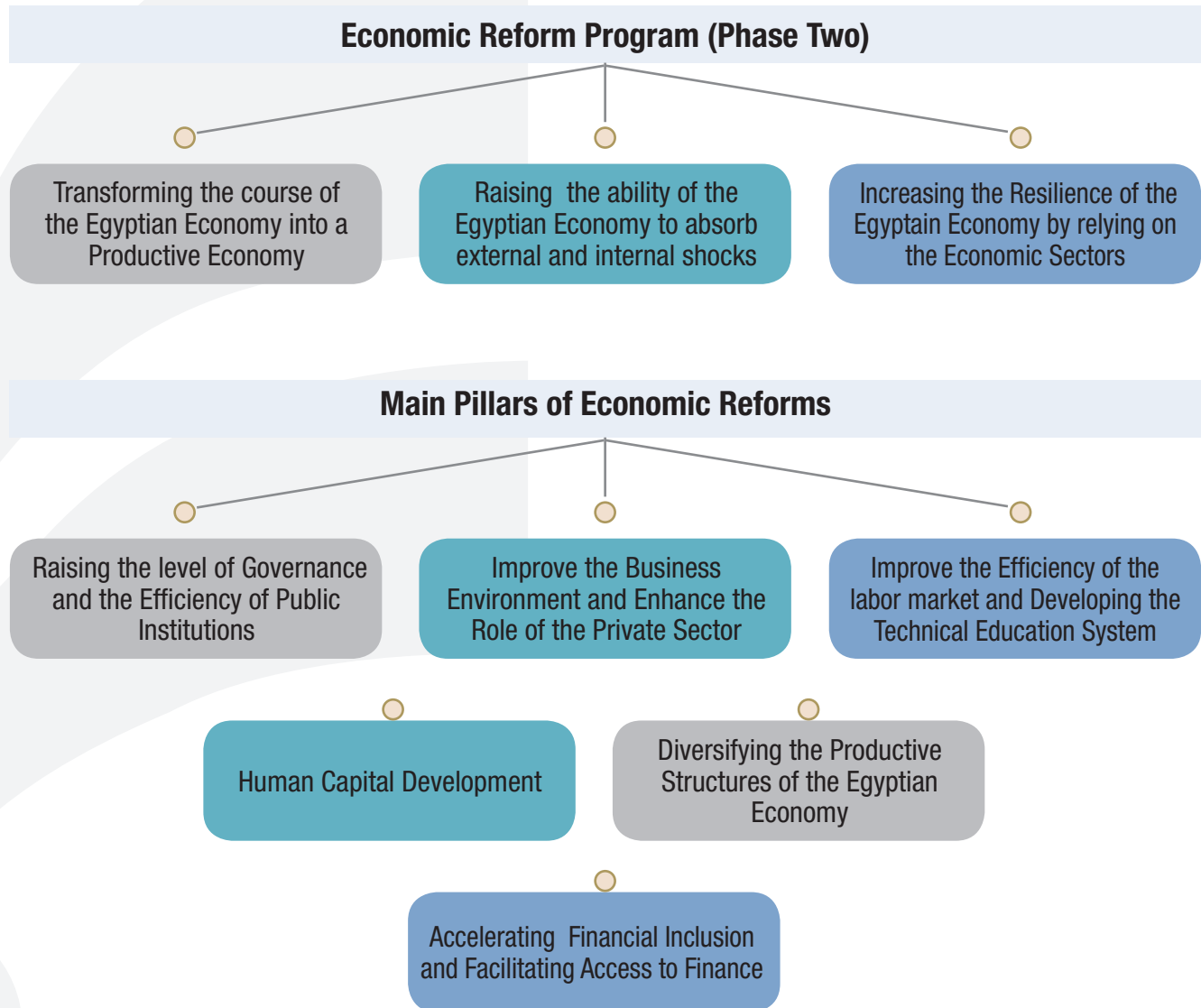

# Competitive Advantages and Potentials to Invest in Egypt

In April 2021, Egypt has launched the second phase of the Economic Reform Program, which is concerned with structural reforms. Such phase will extend over a period of three years, which targets the real sector for the first time with structural reforms.



## Economic Reform Program Positive Outcomes

The economic reform program has contributed to achieving positive outcomes; Most important of which are the increase in economic growth rates, local and foreign investments, employment rates, as well as the decrease in unemployment and inflation rates. It has also contributed to strengthening the ability of the Egyptian economy to confront the negative repercussions of international crises. This is manifested in the containment measures taken by the Government of Egypt, and its successful management of these crises, as well as the elaborate implementation of the reform agenda.



The economic growth rate reached to about 3.8% in FY 2022/23, despite of the continuing international economic and geopolitical challenges, and it is targeted to reach 4.2% in FY 2023/24, despite these challenges.



Egypt's average annual inflation rate reached about 14.9% in 2022, compared to 30.8% in 2017.



Unemployment Rate decreased to 7% in Q2 2023, compared to 12.5% in the same period of 2016.



Egypt's Net International Reserves hiked recording about USD 35.1 billion by the end of October 2023, compared to USD 19.04 billion scored by the end of October 2016.



Net FDI inflows amounted to USD 55.54 billion during the period from FY 2016/17 till FY 2022/23.



Egypt General Budget Deficit decreased to 6.1% during FY 2022/23 (Budget), compared to 10.9% in FY 2016/17.



### Fitch Solutions: Egypt secures its external financing needs during 2023

According to Fitch Solutions, Egypt can secure its external financing needs with a total of USD22 billion during 2023. The agency expected Egypt to achieve an increase in Egyptian exports of goods during FY 2022/2023 by 3%, An increase in net services exports to USD11.4 billion, by 1.7%, driven by the increase in revenues from the Suez Canal, a decrease in the current account deficit of GDP during FY 2022/2023 by 3.6%, compared to 4.1% during FY 2021/2022, and a decrease in the trade balance deficit for goods during FY 2022/2023 to reach USD36 billion, compared to about USD43.4 billion during FY 2021/2022.

## 2. Competitive Procedures for Incorporating Companies and Doing Business

The investment climate in Egypt, especially in the past few years, has witnessed many legislative and institutional reforms aimed at facilitating and streamlining procedures for investors. This has contributed to achieving positive outcomes related to the required time, cost, and number of procedures to incorporate a company and start a business.

## 3. Various Investment Frameworks and Benefits

Investment Law No. 72 of 2017 encompasses many investment frameworks, investors may choose one of these frameworks and incorporate their investment project in accordance with it.

### Domestic Investment

- Domestic Investment Framework encompasses all investment projects established in the local zones – not the Free Zones. In this framework, foreign investors may own 100% of the investment project they establish on the Egyptian lands.
- Investment Law No. 72 of 2017 governs the process of incorporating companies, which can be done through the ISCs. ISCs provide services such as incorporation of companies and the establishment of branches thereof, change of business activity, liquidation, and other services related to companies. domestic Investment projects enjoy general, special and additional incentives prescribed in Investment Law.



### Free Zones

- The Egyptian Free Zones are a part of the State, but they are not subject to the customs, import, and tax legislations in force inside the state's.
- Free Zones are established near seaports and airports so that they can benefit from Egypt's strategic geographical location.
- Free Zones enjoy privileges, guarantees, and incentives considered the best when compared to other free zones across the world. Among these privileges, guarantees, and incentives are the following:



⇒ Investors may freely transfer abroad the capital and the profits of their own investment project.



⇒ Investors may freely choose the business activity and the legal structure of their investment project.



⇒ There are no constraints regarding the nationality of the shareholders except for the investment projects set up in Sinai.



⇒ Foreign investors are granted facilitations regarding residence, and foreign workers are given residence permits based on the project needs.



⇒ Equipment and machinery imported from abroad are exempted from customs duty.



⇒ A free zone project needs only its license-to-operate to deal with various agencies of the State.



⇒ A free zone project's imports and exports to and from the State are exempted from all taxes and customs duty.



⇒ A free zone project's imports and exports to and from the State are not subject to any ordinary customs procedures or importation rules applicable within the State.



⇒ A free zone project's imports from the local market are exempted from the value-added tax (VAT).



⇒ All local components of goods produced by a free zone project are exempted from customs duties, if the goods have been sold in the Egyptian local market.

## Investment Zones

- The Egyptian Investment Zones are geographic areas with defined boundaries and areas that are allocated for one or more specialized investment activities and other complementary businesses. Investment Zones are established by a decree of the Prime Minister.
- Each Investment Zone has a developer licensed to build, operate, develop, or promote it as per the timetable set in the decree of establishment.
- Technological zones are an example of Investment Zones, and they aim to promote activities in the fields of technology and telecommunications.
- Investment Zones have many advantages such as the following:



⇒ Investment Zones operate on an integrated development basis in the fields of agriculture, industry, trade, services, and logistics.



⇒ Investors in this type of zones are provided with lands and industrial units that are fully equipped with utilities.



⇒ Investors can obtain all approvals and licenses from GAFI through simplified procedures.



⇒ An investment zone is run by its board of directors which clears out any obstacles the project has.



⇒ An investment zone project needs only its license-to-operate issued by GAFI to deal with the various entities of the State.



⇒ An executive office affiliated to GAFI deals with all relevant entities of the State on behalf of the investors.



⇒ Investment zones enjoy the general, special and additional incentives stipulated in the law. Furthermore, rules and procedures of temporary customs releases and duty drawback are applied to projects in investment zones.

## 4. Strong Infrastructure and an Integrated Network of Roads and Transportation

Egypt has many advantages and factors in the field of infrastructure, and Egypt has made historic and unprecedented achievements in the field of infrastructure projects, as these projects will contribute to making Egypt one of the most important countries in the Middle East and Africa region, and enhancing its regional and international role.

### Roads and Transportation



#### Roads and Bridges

- The roads and bridges development plan in Egypt includes building of 7000 km of new roads, bringing the total network of freeways and main roads to reach 30 thousand km.
- 10000 km of the current roads network are to be developed.
- It is planned to build 34 new axes on the Nile, bringing the total number of bridges /axes on the Nile to 72.
- One thousand bridges and tunnels are planned to be built, bringing the total number of bridges and tunnels on the road network to 2500.
- Egypt ranked 28th among 141 countries in the world and the 2nd in Africa in terms of the "Quality of Road Infrastructure" index, according to the "Global Competitiveness Report" 2019 issued by the World Economic Forum.

#### Railways

- Egypt's high-speed rail network was established with a total length of about 2000 km.
- The current railway network is being developed through modernizing the signaling systems of 4 main lines with a total of 1900 km.
- A fleet of mobile units is being developed (supplying 260 new tractors - mending/rehabilitation of 172 tractors - supplying 1300 new vehicles - supplying 6 trains - manufacturing 1215 goods vehicles), in addition to development and renovation of railway stations and crossings.
- This development of the railway system aims to increase the number of passengers to reach about 2 million passengers per day instead of one million passengers at the present time, and to increase the volume of transported goods to reach about 13 million tons annually instead of 4.5 million tons.

#### Metro

The Government implements 6 metro lines and five interchange stations, while continuing the development of first and second lines:

- **The First Line:** The design capacity of the line is 2 million passengers/day. It extends from Helwan station to New Marg, with a length of 44 km and 35 stations.
- **The Second Line:** Extends from Shoubra El Kheima to El-Moneeb, with a length of 21.6 km and 20 stations, with a design capacity of 1.76 million passengers/day.
- **The Third Line:** Extends from Imbaba to Adly Mansour interchange station, with a length of 41.2 km and 34 stations.
- **The Fourth Line:** It links between 6th of October City and New Cairo. The line is expected to transport about 2 million passengers per day. The total length of the line is 42 km including 38 stations.
- **The Sixth Line:** It links the north of Cairo with its south, as the proposed route for the project extends from El-Khosous to New Maadi, with a length of 35 km and 27 stations.

## Electric High Speed Rail (HSR)

This project links the New Administrative Capital and the new cities with the railway network to facilitate transporting passengers and goods. The project comprises three lines:

- **The Green Line (Ain Sokhna - Marsa Matrouh):**

It extends from Ain Sokhna to New Alamein and then to Marsa Matrouh with a length of 660 km, and the line includes 22 stations, to transport passengers and goods.

- **The Blue Line (Fayoum /Beni Suef - Luxor - Abu Simbel):**

It starts from Fayoum station/ Beni Suef to Abu Simbel city, with a length of 1100 km west of the Upper Egypt Western Desert Road, and the line includes 35 stations.

This line exchanges service with Ain Sukhna - Marsa Matrouh line at October Gardens Station, as well as exchanging service with Qena - Hurghada - Safaga line at Qena Station.

- **The Red Line (Qena - Safaga):**

It extends from the interchange station (Qena station) with the Blue Line and then extends eastward to Hurghada then to Safaga Port, with a length of 225 km and includes 3 stations.

## Light Rail Train (LRT)

The electric light rail project links the New Administrative Capital with the governorates of Cairo and Giza and the downtown area to facilitate transporting passengers using a safe and non-polluting means of transport, as the line will transport about 500 thousand passengers per day. It also provides an exchange service with Cairo Metro Line 3 (Adly Mansour/Cairo University) at Adly Mansour Station, allowing the exchange of service between 5 different means of transportation.

- **The First and Second Phases:**

The first and second phases were inaugurated on July 3, 2022, which extend from Adly Mansour station in Al Salam area to the City of Arts and Culture station at the New Administrative Capital, with a length of 68.81 km, and 12 stations.

- **The Third Phase:**

Extends to the south from the Cathedral of Nativity station to the Central Capital station to exchange service with "Ain Sokhna/Matrouh" high-speed rail, with a length of 18.5 km and 4 stations.

- **The Fourth Phase:**

Extends from 10th of Ramadan City to the Administrative Capital to the south and then to Adly Mansour Interchange Station to the west, with a length of 16 km and 3 stations.

## Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)

- The BRT is one of the State's projects and plans that aim to provide distinguished services to passengers and to reduce the traffic congestion on the Ring Road.

- It is a flexible and safe public transport system that is characterized by large capacities, runs on specialized tracks, and works with electricity, which contributes to reducing environmental pollution.

- It transports 4,000 passengers in one hour, as one train can accommodate 170 passengers per trip, and the buses are expandable.

- The bus operates according to a scheduled turnover time.

- The project has 48 stations along the Ring Road, the implementation of 33 of these has started.

- Stations will be allocated at the main intersections of the bus on the ring road, and the entire ring road will be covered with cameras through the implementation of the ITS system to achieve the highest levels of safety and security on the road.

## Monorail Project

The project, with a total of **35** stations, represents a leap and transformation in the means of transportation in Egypt and will contribute to saving fuel consumption and environmental pollution rates, and includes:

- The Monorail of the New Administrative Capital, which is being implemented with a 56.5 km long and comprises **22** stations.
- The Monorail of 6th of October City, which is being implemented with a 42 km long and comprises **13** stations.

The efficiency of air navigation and surveillance systems is being updated and upgraded.

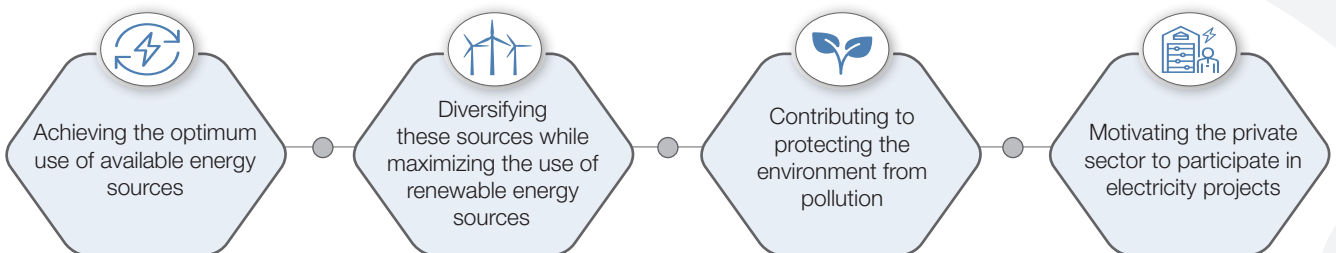
Security measures are being enhanced, which was reflected in placing Egypt in a privileged position among international companies and institutions.

## Electricity and Energy

- The electricity sector has prepared an integrated strategy until 2035 based on several pillars, the most important of which are:



- The total generated and purchased energy during the FY2021/2022 increased to about **213,182** (GWh) compared to about **204,071** (GWh) during the FY2020/2021.
- Electricity production from hydropower amounted to about **14,769** (GWh), and from thermal energy to about **168,478** (GWh) during the FY2020/2021.
- The total production of new and renewable energy in Egypt during the FY2021/2022 increased to about **10,4** (GWh) compared to about 10.2 (GWh) during the FY2020/2021.

Egypt ranked **5<sup>th</sup>** globally in the “Energy Use Index” according to the Climate Change Performance Index 2023, issued by "German watch - November 2022"

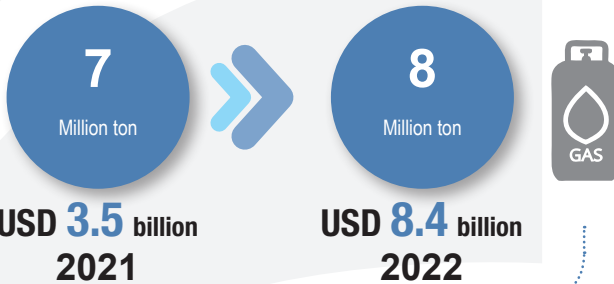
Egypt will become **the largest** producer of wind energy on the African continent by 2030, followed by Morocco and Algeria according to "Reuters - March 2023".

## Petroleum and Natural Gas

- The total production of petroleum wealth amounted to about 79.5 million tons, with a production of about 27.8 million tons of crude oil and condensate, 50.6 million tons natural gas, and 1.1 million tons butane gas during 2022.
- Egypt's exports of liquefied gas increased to reach about 8 million tons, with a total value of about USD 8.4 billion during 2022, compared to about 7 million tons with a total value of about USD 3.5 billion during 2021.

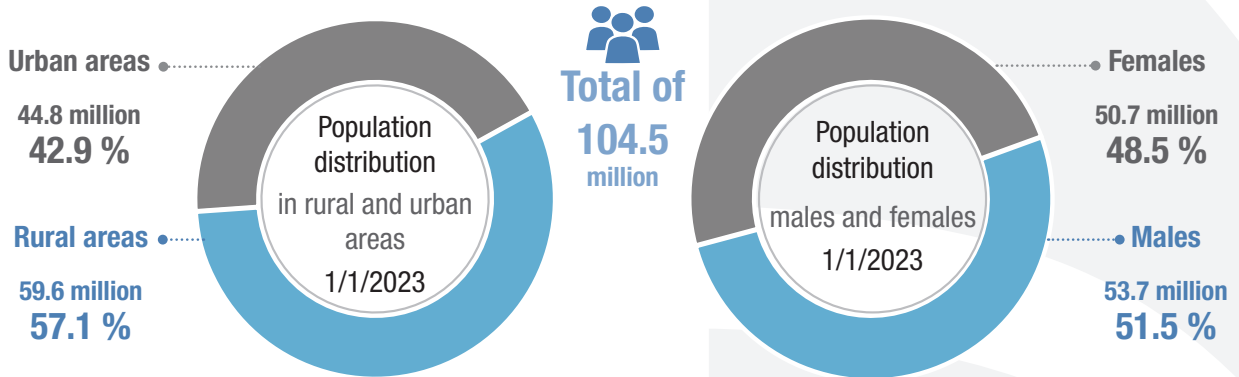

## 5. A Large Consumer Market and a Distinct Distribution of Population

Egypt is classified as the most populous country in Africa and the Middle East. Egypt has witnessed a remarkable increase in the sales of retail market and an influx of products of major international companies, as Egypt attracts many international brands because these companies find Egypt as a large market for distributing their products. Therefore, the growing population and the large number of age groups with a great tendency to consume are considered motivating factors for any investor to invest in the Egyptian market.

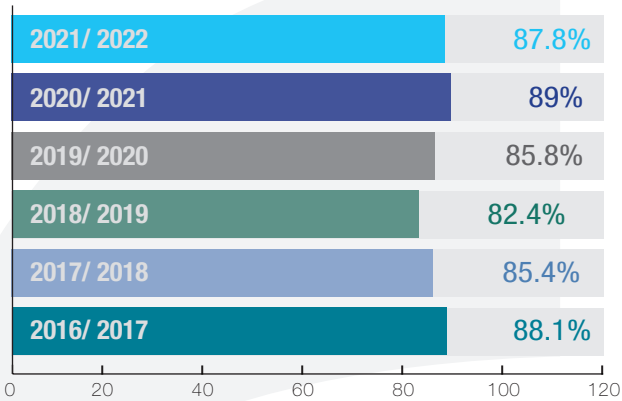

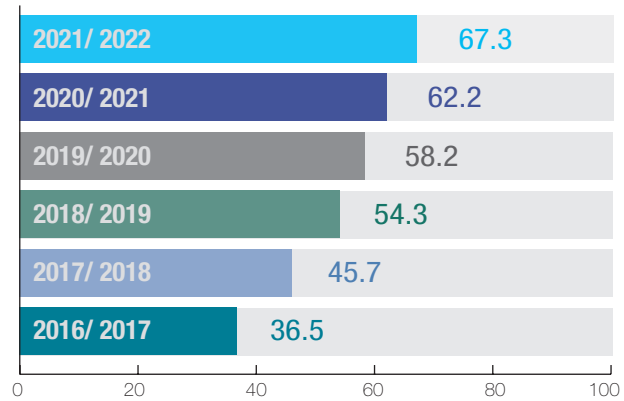

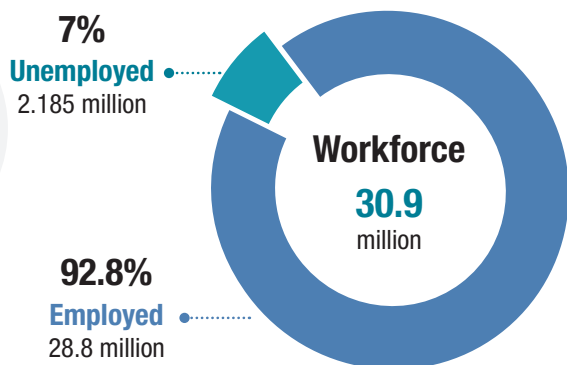

## 6. Trained Skilled Labor and Competitive Average Wages

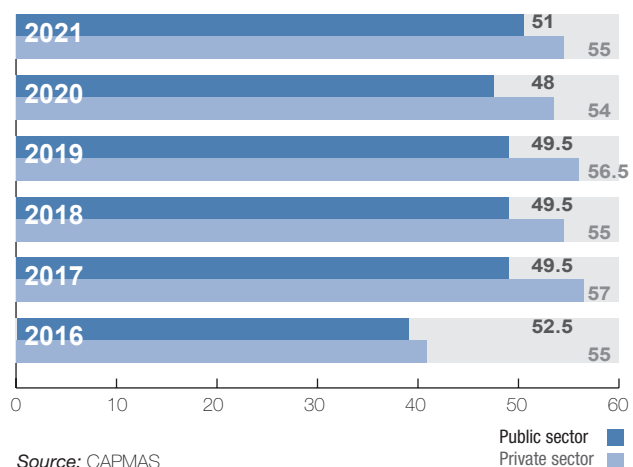
Egypt's competitiveness in the field of human resources is represented in its ability to provide skilled and trained workers in various fields, in addition to the competitiveness of wages, which are lower than similar ones in the world. The workforce in Egypt, which is estimated **30.9 million** at the end of Q2 of 2023, are considered among the most skilled labor in the Middle East region for several decades. 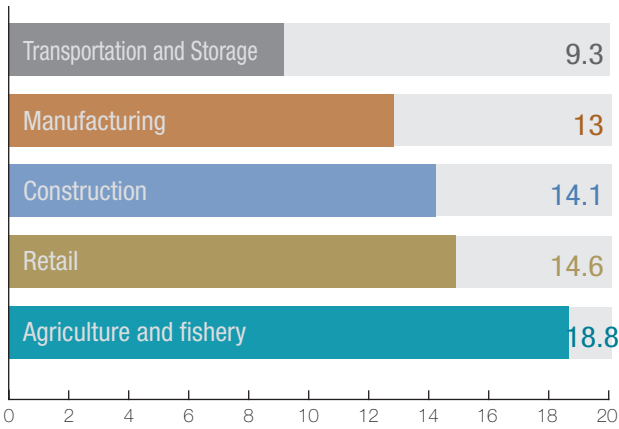

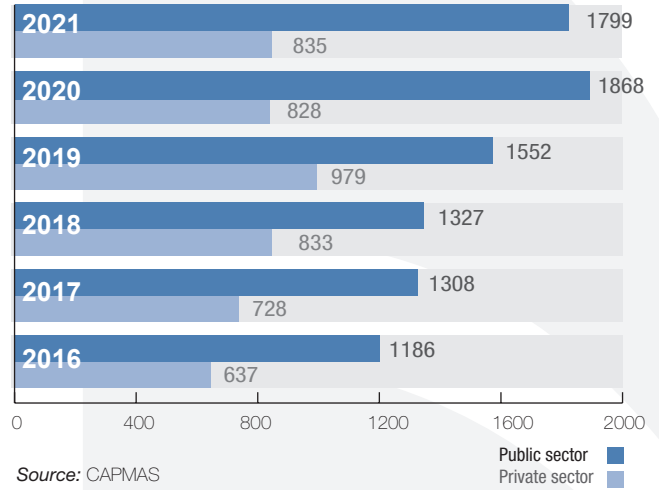
**Sectoral Distribution of Employed people (Q2 2023)**

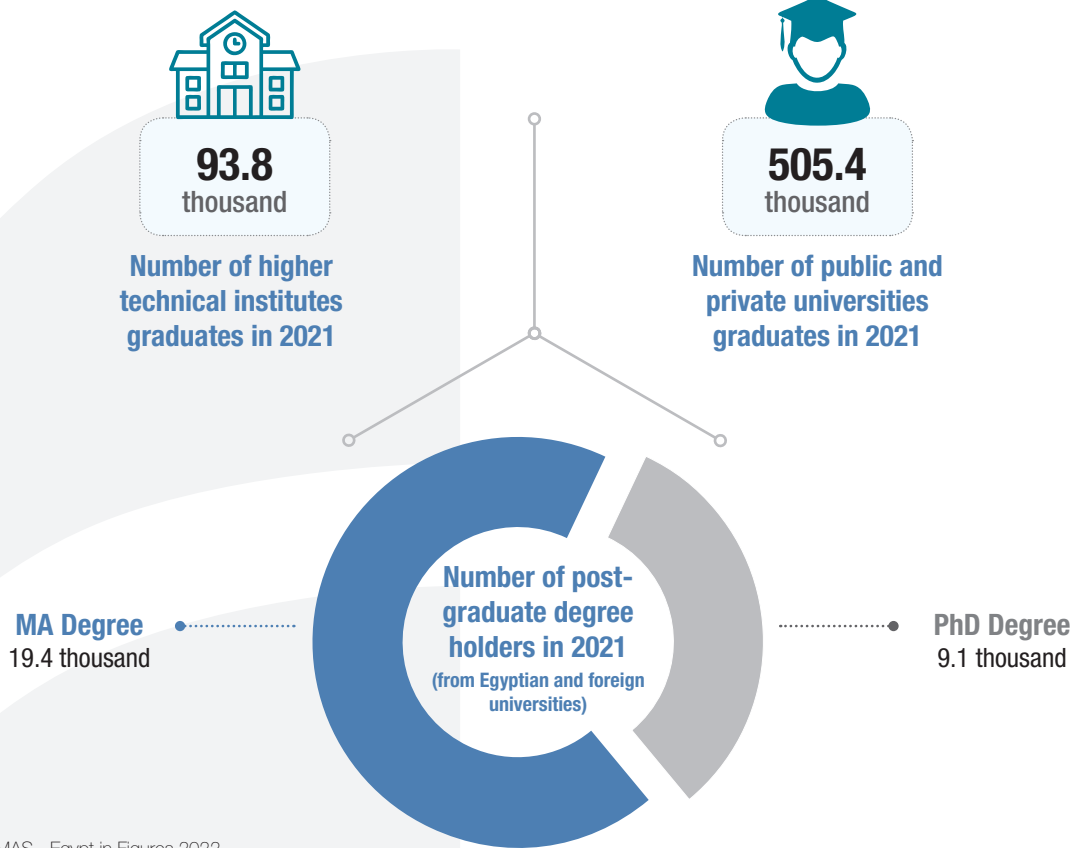

## Investment in Human Capital Initiative

The initiative of H.E. President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi to invest in human capital is considered a paradigm shift in Egypt. The initiative encompasses the development of youth skills and training them to meet the requirements of the labor market, in accordance with the private sector, as well as the development of education, health care and community-based protection networks. It also aims at formulating school feeding programs that would ensure bringing up a healthy generation of children more focused, capable of consuming more knowledge, acquiring the skills necessary for the labor market, and improving the income of their families. Furthermore, the government of Egypt implements the mandate of the political leadership; through injecting more grants into the sectors of health, education, training programs, and youth qualification. Moreover, Egypt has recently succeeded, through its development partners, in supporting the health and the education sectors. Coordination is being made with international financing institutions to provide more grants to support Egypt to invest in human capital.

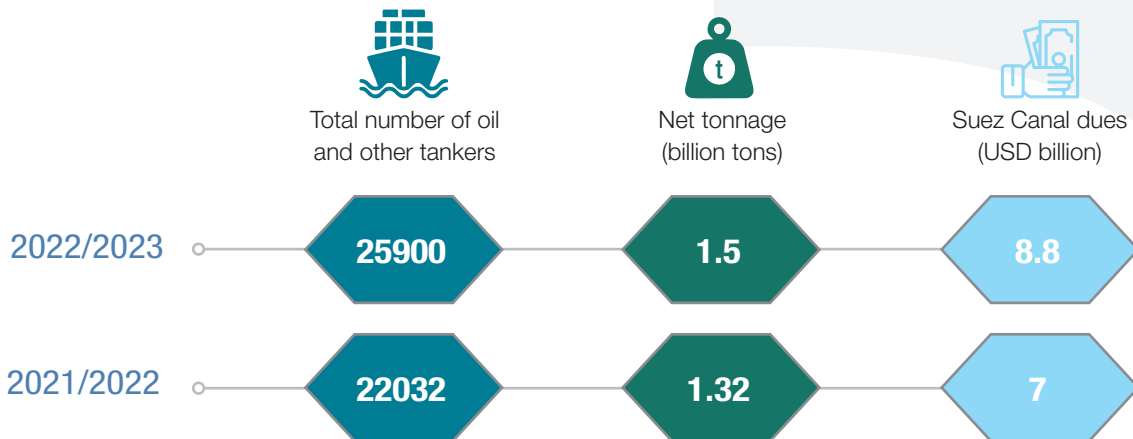

## ■ Suez Canal

The Suez Canal contributes significantly to the Egyptian economy. It plays an important role in increasing the national income through the tolls collected in return for ships' transit through the Canal; more than **12%** of the shipping vessels in the world pass through it every year. The Suez Canal saves distance and a lot of time, as well as shipping costs for ships passing through it from the East to the West or vice versa, especially after the completion of the New Suez Canal project.



The total number of vessels transiting Suez Canal (petroleum and others) during the FY 2022/2023 amounted to **25900** vessels with a total tonnage estimated at **1.5** billion tons. The total dues of Suez Canal amounted to about USD **8.8** billion.

## ■ Cairo - Cape Town Road



In the framework of strengthening efforts of countries in the Continent to achieve sustainable development goals, promote the standard of living of the African citizen, and increase rates of flows of trade and inter-investment, Egypt works on linking Africa's North with its South through various projects that are implemented in parallel. Among these projects is Alexandria-Cairo-Cape Town Road. This road starts from Egypt, passes through a number of countries in the central and eastern Africa, including Sudan, Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanzania, Zambia, Zimbabwe, and Gabon, and ends in South Africa.

- It is the longest road in Africa, with a length of 10,288 km, (which passes through the Egyptian land with a length of 1,155 km west of the Nile. In Egypt, this project will undergo four (4) phases, which will be completed by 2024.
- Moreover, it will contribute to increasing the volume of trade exchanges between Egypt and the countries of the African continent, and to achieving unity and interdependence of the African States in the North and the South.



## ■ Sokhna/Dekheila traffic axis to link between the red sea and the Mediterranean Sea:

Within the framework of implementing the strategy to turn Egypt into an international hub for trade and logistics, the government has started to implement a new axis to link between the red sea and the Mediterranean Sea which will be the largest logistics corridor to serve global trade between east and west, and transform Sokhna and Dekheila ports into regional hubs in order to open new markets for Egypt's exports.

**Agility Emerging Markets Logistics Index:** Egypt's rank in Agility Emerging Markets Logistics Index improved during 2022, as Egypt ranked 21<sup>st</sup> among 50 countries in terms of emerging markets. Egypt also rose 2 places to come in the 13<sup>th</sup> place in the index of the emerging logistics markets with the most potential for growth.

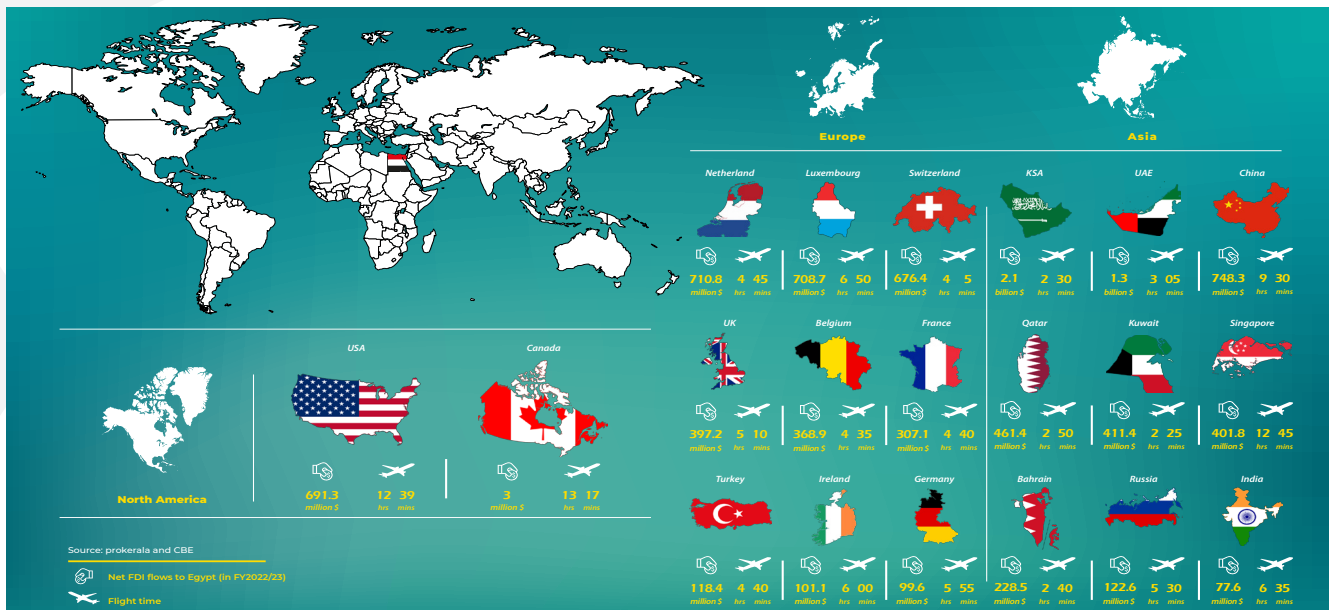

## 8. Multiple Commercial Agreements:

In recent years, Egypt has signed a large group of trade agreements with many countries aiming at expanding the circle of Egyptian exports, in order to achieve more national income by opening more global markets and promoting Egyptian products abroad, and attract more foreign investments. The most important of these agreements are as follows:

### ■ The Pan Arab Free Trade Area (PAFTA) Agreement:

Entered into force in 1998, and it aims at establishing Greater Arab Free Trade Area (GAFTA) that includes 17 Arab States, and all exchanged goods were gradually liberalized until 2005.

### ■ Egypt and the Partnership Agreement with EU:

Entered into force in 2004, the agreement allows attracting direct investments from EU, as the agreement stipulated that the necessary measures must be taken to encourage the transfer of capital between the two parties with the aim of encouraging investment. The increase of the Egyptian industrial exports to the European markets by eliminating customs duties and any other fees of a similar effect.

### ■ Egypt-UK Partnership Agreement:

Entered into force in 2021, and aims to ensure the preferential bilateral trade for the products of the two countries following Brexit.

### ■ A Free Trade Area between Arab Mediterranean Countries “Agadir Agreement”:

Entered into force in 2006, and aims to Application of cumulative rules of origin, which contributes to strengthening and supporting economic and commercial cooperation among member states.

### ■ EFTA Free Trade Agreement:

Entered into force in 2007, and aims to establish a FTA with EFTA countries (Iceland - Norway - Switzerland - the Principality of Liechtenstein), which is considered the most important European market outside EU.

### ■ African Continental Free Trade Agreement (AFTCA):

Entered into force in 2021. Membership in FTA includes all countries of the African Union (55 countries) aiming at removing tariff and non-tariff barriers on intra-African trade, creating a market of more than one billion people and Exceeding GDP USD 3 trillion.

### ■ The Common Market Agreement for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA):

Entered into force (as for Egypt) in 1999, and according this agreement all Egyptian goods that are exported to member states enjoy complete exemption from all customs duties, fees and other taxes of similar effect according to the percentages of reductions approved by each country and based on the principle of reciprocity.

### ■ Agreement of the Three Blocs (COMESA - SADC - East African community (EAC)):

Egypt ratified the agreement in 2021, the agreement aims to Establish free trade zone between the three African blocs, which includes 26 countries through liberalization trade from tariff and non-tariff barriers.

## ■ FTA between Egypt and Mercosur (South American Common Market):



Egypt is the first African country to sign an agreement with MERCOSUR countries, and this gives Egypt a comparative advantage in terms of the cost of exporting to the markets of these countries. The agreement reduces the cost of Egyptian imports of some products, and aims to exempt more than 90% of the goods exchanged between the two parties from all customs duties, and enhancing cooperation in the areas of investment and services, in addition to Exemption of about 47% of Egyptian exports to the four countries from customs duties once the agreement enters into force.

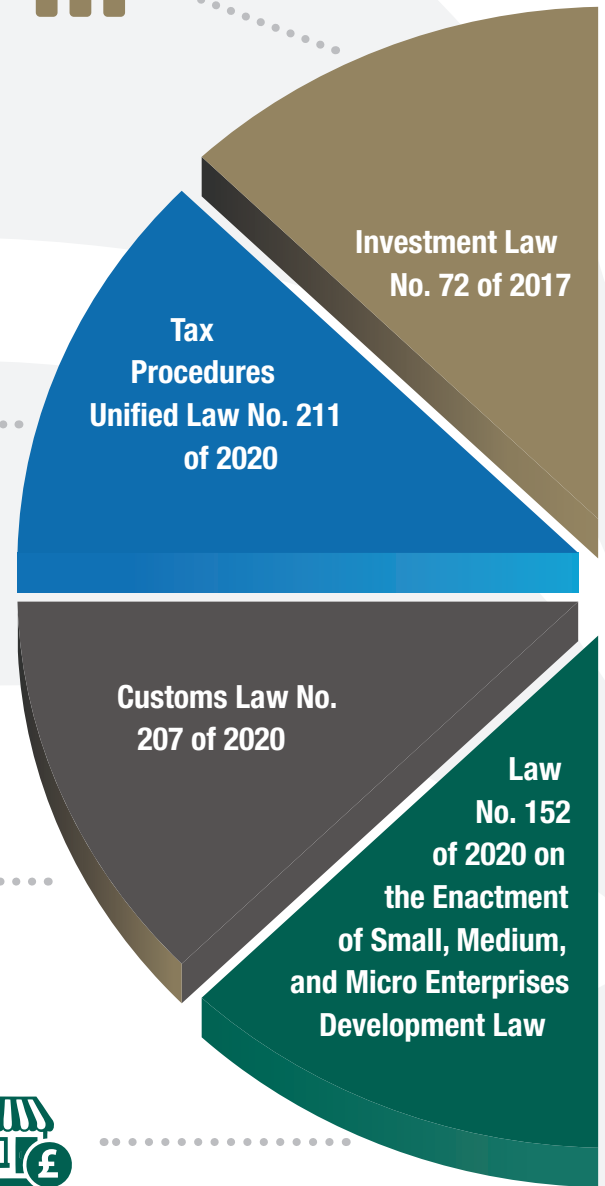
## I. Important Laws and Legislations Regulating to Investment Climate

The Law aims to achieve more confidence in the Egyptian investment climate by increasing the guarantees granted to investors and diversifying the tax and customs incentives to the targeted economic sectors and geographical areas most in need of development, while ensuring the provision of advanced investment services to achieve sustainable development, and amending of some provisions of this law by issuing law No.160 of 2023, these amendments aim to enjoy all the Investment Projects governed by the provisions of this Law whether they have been incorporated before or after this Law has come into force and irrespective of the legal framework governing same, enjoy the general incentives stipulated in this law exception being made for Investment Projects set up under the Free Zone Framework, and expanding the granting of special and additional incentives, as well as granting the golden license.

Law No. 211 of 2020 amending certain provisions of the tax procedures unified law enacted by Law No. 206 of 2020 encompasses rules on the modification or estimation of taxes as well as the penalties on failure to submit tax declaration. According to the law, the Tax Authority may not in any case whatsoever modify or estimate the tax unless within 5 years from the expiry date of the deadline set for submission of tax declaration. However, said deadline may be suspended for any of the reasons set forth in the Civil Code. It may also be suspended if the taxpayer/taxable person has been notified of the estimated tax or of payment thereof, or if the matter has been referred to the appeal committees.

The Law aims to facilitate customs transactions and achieve digitalization in the provision of customs services along with the development of a new market regulation that includes clear and specific rules for customs.

This Law provides many tax and non-tax incentives and benefits. It includes a simplified and permanent tax system contributing to alleviating enterprise tax burdens. According to this Law, the tax is fixed and simplified based on the volume of sales or business without the need for books, documents, or purchase invoices. The Law also exempts small, medium, and micro enterprises (SMEs) and informal economy enterprises, applying for legalization of standing, from stamp tax and from the fees prescribed for registration of articles of incorporation, credit facility contracts, and mortgages in connection with the enterprise for a period of 5 years from the date of registration with the Commercial Register. Land registration contracts required for setting up the enterprise are also exempt from stamp tax.



# Legislations and Incentives to Attract Investment



The provisions of this law apply to government administrative subdivisions, including ministries, authorities, and agencies having their own budgets, to units of local administration, and to public bodies, whether they are of service or economic nature. The law provides new methods for entering into contracts. It provides a two-phase tenders process to overcome events in which it is not possible to provide an accurate technical description of items, technical works, services, consultant studies or projects that the entity wishes to procure. In a view to rationalizing public spending, to find solutions to specific problems arising out of the complex nature of the items/works/studies/services being procured.

**Public Procurement Law No. 188 of 2020**

**Law No. 11 of 2021 Amending Certain Provisions of the Bankruptcy Law:**



According to this Law, once restructuring/preventive composition starts, all claims will cease. A debtor will no longer be prohibited from continuing the administration of his assets or acquiring new funding and will be separated from previous creditors. The notice process has been facilitated to save time. In addition, the Bankruptcy Law regulates the restructuring process; which is: "each trader whose capital is no less than one million Egyptian Pounds, who has been continuously carrying out trade in the two years precedent to the submission of the application and who has not committed a fraud – may apply for a restructuring."

**Companies Law No. 159 of 1981**



The Law regulates companies' activities in Egypt, rules of incorporation, and liabilities, rights and duties of such companies. The Law regulates how companies, investors, shareholders, managers, employees, creditors and other stakeholders interact in order to achieve the principles of governance.

**Central Bank and Banking Sector Law No. 194 of 2020**



The Law aims to develop a new framework for banking governance in accordance with the best international practices in this regard, in order to ensure the strengthening of Banks' BoD(s) role, guarantee competency of key officials, and prevent conflicts of interest.

## II. Investment Guarantees and Incentives

### 1- Investment Guarantees



- All investments established within the Arab Republic of Egypt shall be accorded fair and equitable treatment.



- The State shall guarantee that the foreign investor receives the same treatment accorded to the national investor. In application of the principle of reciprocity, foreign investors may, as an exception subject to a decree of the Council of Ministers, receive a preferential treatment.



- Invested Assets may neither be subject to any arbitrary measures nor discriminatory decisions.



- The State shall grant non-Egyptian Investors residence in the Arab Republic of Egypt throughout the term of the Investment Project, without prejudice to the provisions of the laws regulating this respect and the stipulations of the Executive Regulations of this Law.



- The State shall honor and enforce the contracts entered into thereby. Investment Project, set up on a basis of fraud, fraudulent misrepresentation or corruption, may not enjoy the protection, guarantees, privileges or exemptions stipulated under the provisions of this Law; proof of the foregoing shall be produced by a irrevocable judgment – delivered by the judicial authority of competent jurisdiction – or by an arbitration award.



- All decisions on Investment Project affairs shall be reasoned decisions. Service of notice of such decisions on the parties concerned shall be carried out in the manner set forth in the Executive Regulations of this Law.



- Investment Projects may not be nationalized.



- Assets of Investment Project may not be expropriated unless for public utility and in return for a just compensation to be paid in advance without delay. The value of the compensation shall amount to the economic value of the expropriated assets on the preceding day to the issuance of the expropriation decision. Such compensation shall be freely transferrable.



- Subject to the situations specified in law, Investment Project may not be sequestered through administrative procedures, save when warranted by virtue of a final court judgment, nor may it be subject to attachment, save when warranted by virtue of a court order or judgment.



- Assets of Investment Project may neither be seized nor confiscated nor frozen, save when warranted by virtue of a court order or final judgment, with the exception of tax debts and social insurance subscriptions due to the State; such debts and subscriptions may be collected by all kinds of seizure, without prejudice to the contracts entered into by the State or public juridical persons with Investor.



- Any administrative body may not issue general regulatory decisions that add financial or procedural burdens in respect of the setup or operation of the projects governed by this Law, nor may it impose or amend the fees or consideration for services prescribed for the projects, except after having obtained the opinion of the board of directors of GAFI («GAFI BoD») and upon the approval of both the Council of Ministers and SCI.

## Legislations and Incentives to Attract Investment



- An administrative body may not revoke or suspend the licenses issued for Investment Project, nor may it reclaim the real property allocated for same, unless it has served a notice on Investor comprising the violations with which Investor is charged, has heard Investor's evidence and has given Investor an adequate grace period to rectify the violations. In all cases, GAFI's opinion shall be obtained before taking any of the actions referred to in the aforementioned paragraph. GAFI shall give its opinion within seven (7) days from the date on which GAFI receives a request to that effect satisfying all prescribed legal procedures. Investment Law as Enacted by Law No. 72 of 2017 15 Investor may file a grievance against the aforementioned actions before the committee stated in Article (83) of this Law.



- Investor shall have the right to set up, launch and expand Investment Project, and shall fund same from abroad without any restrictions and with foreign currencies. Investor shall have the right to own, manage, use and dispose of Investment Project, to make profits from Investment Project, to transfer such profits abroad, to liquidate Investment Project and to transfer, whether in whole or in part, the proceeds of such liquidation abroad, without prejudice to the rights of third parties.



- The State shall permit all cash transfers in respect of foreign investment to be freely and promptly transferrable to and from the State using a freely convertible currency. The State shall permit conversion of local currency into a freely usable currency without delay.



- In case of liquidation, the appropriate administrative bodies shall, within maximum one hundred and twenty (120) days from the date on which the liquidator has filed an application of liquidation enclosing the required documentation, serve on GAFI and the company under liquidation a notice comprising a statement of liabilities of such company. The expiry of this period without notification of such liabilities shall be deemed a discharge on the part of the company under liquidation from said liabilities, without prejudice to the criminal and disciplinary liability of the person responsible for issuing a false statement or the person responsible for the lapse of the aforementioned time limit without replying to the application



- Without prejudice to the provisions of the laws, regulations and decrees regulating importation, Investment Project governed by the provisions of this Law shall have the right to import, whether directly or through third parties, 16 Investment Law as Enacted by Law No. 72 of 2017 the necessary raw materials, production requirements, machinery, spare parts and means of transportation – compatible with nature of business of Investment Project – for the setup, expansion or operation of Investment Project, without the need to be registered in the Register of Importers.



- Investment Project shall have the right to export its products, whether directly or through an intermediary, without a license and without the need to be registered in the Register of Exporters



- An Investment Project shall have the right to employ foreign workers up to ten percent (10%) of the total number of Investment Project workers. Subject to the rules and controls laid down by the Executive Regulations of this Law, this percentage may be increased up to twenty percent (20%), should employment of national workers having the required qualifications be not possible. For some strategic projects with special significance as listed by a decree of SCI, exceptions from the aforementioned percentages may be made, conditional on providing training to the national labor



- Foreign workers in Investment Project shall have the right to transfer their financial dues, in whole or in part, abroad.

## 2- General Incentives

As per Article (11) of Investment Law No. 72 of 2017, projects set up, after the coming into force of this Law, in accordance with the investment map shall be granted an investment incentive, in the form of a discount off the taxable net profits, as follows:

### (a) General Incentives

According to Article (9), all Investment Projects governed by the provisions of this Law shall, whether they have been incorporated before or after this Law has become in force and irrespective of the legal framework governing same, enjoy the general incentives, exception being made for Investment Projects set up under the Free Zone Framework, which are:

- Articles of incorporation of companies and establishments, along with credit facility and pledge contracts pertaining to the business thereof, shall be exempt from stamp duty as well as notarization and publicity fees for a period of five (5) years from the date on which such articles of incorporation and contracts are entered in the Commercial Register.
- Contracts of registration of lands required for formation of companies and establishments shall be exempt from the aforementioned duty and fees.
- A 2% uniform customs duty shall be collected on:
  - ▶ All imported machinery, equipment and devices required for formation of companies or establishments.
  - ▶ All machinery, equipment and devices imported by companies and establishments that operate on public utility projects, and required for the formation or completion thereof.
- Without prejudice to the provisions of temporary release stipulated in Customs Law enacted by Law No. 66 of 1963, Investment Projects of industrial nature, governed by the provisions of this Law, may import casts, molds and other similar production requirements, subject to no customs fees; however, such imported items shall be for the purpose of temporary use in manufacturing the products of said Investment Projects, and shall be repatriated thereafter. Said temporary release and repatriation shall be effected by virtue of the arrival documents, provided the documents of admission and reshipment are entered in ad hoc registers at GAFI designated for that purpose; this shall be in coordination with the Ministry of Finance.



### (b) Special Incentives

As per Article (11) of Investment Law No. 72 of 2017, projects set up, after the coming into force of this Law, in accordance with the investment map shall be granted an investment incentive, in the form of a discount off the taxable net profits, as follows:

#### 1. A fifty-percent (50%) discount off the investment costs of Sector (A):

- This sector comprises the geographic areas designated as most in need of development, based on the investment map, the data and statistics issued by the Central Agency for Public Mobilization and Statistics ("CAPMS") approved by the general plan for economic development.
- The geographic territory of Sectors (A) encompass Suez Canal Economic Zone, al-Muthalath al-Dhaby (Golden Triangle) Economic Zone and the most-in-need-of-development areas, which are characterized by: low economic development, low domestic production, low employment rates, low job opportunities, low quality of education, low level of health services, high unemployment rates, high population densities, high illiteracy rates, and high rates of poverty.

## 2. A thirty-percent (30%) discount off the investment costs of Sector (B):

This sector covers the remaining geographic areas of the Republic, as per the distribution of investment activities, in respect of the following projects:

- Labor-intensive projects, subject to the controls prescribed in the Executive Regulations of this Law;
- SMEs;
- Projects depending on or producing new and renewable energy;
- National and strategic projects to be listed under a decree of the Supreme Council of Investment SCI;
- Tourism projects to be listed under a decree of ("SCI");
- Electricity generation and distribution projects to be listed under a decree of the Prime Minister, based on a joint proposal of the Appropriate Minister, the minister concerned with electricity affairs and Minister of Finance;
- Projects exporting no less than fifty percent (50%) of products thereof outside the geographic territory of the Arab Republic of Egypt;
- Automotive manufacturing and the supplying industries thereof;
- Wood, furniture, printing, packaging and chemical industries;
- Antibiotics, tumor drugs and cosmetics industries;
- Food, agricultural crops and agricultural waste recycling industries;
- Engineering, metallurgical, textile and leather industries; and
- Industries pertaining to information technology and telecommunications.

Pursuant to the provisions of Income Tax Law enacted by Law No. 91 of 2005, an investment incentive may not, in all cases, exceed eighty percent (80%) of the capital paid up until the date on which engagement in the activity starts. The discount period may not exceed seven (7) years from the date on which engagement in the activity starts.

### Conditions for enjoying special incentives:

In accordance with Article (12), Investment Project shall, in order for it to enjoy the Special Incentives stipulated in Article (11), satisfy the following conditions:



▪ A new company or establishment shall be incorporated to launch such Investment Project;



▪ Said new company or establishment must be incorporated within a period not exceeding three (3) years from the Law's Executive Regulations enforcement date. ~~By a decree of the Council of Ministers based on Appropriate Minister's recommendation, such period may be renewed for other periods not exceeding in total nine (9) years;~~



▪ Said new company or establishment shall keep regular accounts; should such company or establishment be operating in more than one zone, it may benefit from the percentage prescribed for each zone respectively, provided that it keeps separate accounts for each zone respectively; and



▪ Neither shareholders nor partners nor owners of establishments have offered, contributed or used any of the tangible assets of a company or an establishment, existing since the date on which the provisions of this Law come into force, in setting up, incorporating or launching an Investment Project enjoying the incentives accorded by this Law, nor have they liquidated such company or establishment, within the time period specified in Item 2 of this Article (12), for the purpose of setting up a new Investment Project enjoying the incentives of this Law; violation of this condition nullifies said incentives, and accordingly such company or establishment shall pay all taxes due.

## 3. A percentage ranges from (35% - 55%) for investment projects engaged in any industrial activity to be determined in accordance with Article (11), as follows:

In accordance with Article (11 bis.), Investment Projects engaged in any industrial activity to be determined in accordance with this Article shall be granted a cash incentive ranging from 35% up to 55% of the value of the tax paid in the tax declaration on the income generated from carrying on business in Investment Project or the expansions thereof.

## Legislations and Incentives to Attract Investment

In accordance with Article (11 bis.) an Investment Project shall, to be granted the special incentive specified in this Article, satisfy the following conditions:

- An Investment Project or the expansions thereof shall, till the date of business commencement, rely on at least 50% of their financing on foreign currency; and
- Said Investment Project shall start operations within a period of six (6) years from the date this Article comes into force. Such period may, by a decree of the Council of Ministers be extended for six (6) years.

### **(c) Additional Incentives:**

In accordance with Article (13), additional incentives shall be granted to projects specified in Article (11) and Article (11 bis.), as follows:

- Permission to establish special customs ports of entry for Investment Project importations or exportations, in agreement with Minister of Finance;
- Upon Investment Project becoming operational, payment, whether in whole or in part, by the State for the expenses incurred by Investor in course of providing utilities to the premises of Investment Project;
- Payment by the State for a part of the expenses incurred in course of providing personnel technical training;
- Refund at fifty percent (50%) of the value of the land allocated for the industrial projects, should production start within two (2) years from the date on which the land was handed over;
- Allocation of lands free of charge to some strategic activities in accordance with the legally prescribed rules in this respect;
- Exemption from usufruct fees imposed against the lands allocated to set Investment Project for a period up to ten (10) years as of operations start date.
- Exemption not exceeding (50%) to Projects from contributing to the costs of establishing infrastructure, and public services and utilities, in accordance with the rules to be set by the Supreme Council of Investment Decree.

### **Additional Incentives Conditions:**

Pursuant to Article (12) of the Executive Regulations of the Investment Law no. 72 of 2017, the additional incentives stipulated in Article (13) of the Investment Law may only be granted to companies and establishments which have started production or engaged in activity, as the case may be, in accordance with the report approved by GAFI, and must satisfy one of the following conditions:

- The Arab Republic of Egypt is one of the principal places of production of products in which such companies and establishments specialize, or the principal place of the products in which such companies and establishments specialize is the Arab Republic of Egypt;
- Such companies and establishments, in course of financing their projects, depend on foreign cash transferred from abroad through an Egyptian bank in accordance with the rules specified by CBE BoD;
- Such companies and establishments export abroad no less than fifty percent (50%) of their products;
- The activity of a company or an establishment includes operation in any cutting-edge modern technology field and cutting-edge technology transfer into Egypt, and support of industries supplying such field or transfer;
- The local component is strongly included in the products of an Investment Project, provided that the percentage of local components, including raw materials and production requirements, in the products of the Investment Project, is no less than fifty percent (50%), in accordance with the applicable rules of the Industrial Development Authority; or
- The activity of a company or an establishment is based on research conclusions reached through research projects carried out inside the Arab Republic of Egypt.

## Legislations and Incentives to Attract Investment



### Comprehensive Approval (Golden License)

According to Article (20) of the Investment Law, companies incorporated to set up a strategic or a national project may be granted a comprehensive approval to build, run, and manage such project. This approval is comprehensive of all building permits and allocated real property. It is a self-executing approval requiring no further procedure.





### III. Decrees for Implementation of Investment Incentives

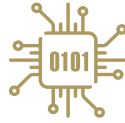
- **Prime Minister Decree No. 104 of 2022:** According to this Decree, industry; tourism; information technology and telecommunications; petroleum and natural resources; agriculture; animal wealth; fish production; and transportation activities are classified into subsectors falling within the geographical territory of Sectors (A) and (B). As per Article (II) of the Decree, companies and establishments addressed by the provisions of the Decree must obtain the required approvals, permits, and licenses from the competent authorities based on the nature of each activity mentioned in the classification tables.
- **Prime Minister Decree No. 981 of 2022:** According to this Decree, electricity and renewable energy; education; and sports activities are classified into subsectors falling within the geographical territory of Sectors (A) and (B). Moreover, Companies and establishments addressed by the provisions of Article (I) of the Decree must obtain approvals, permits, and licenses from the competent authorities in accordance with the nature of each activity to be granted the incentives mentioned in the two tables attached to the Decree.
- **Prime Minister decree No. 1775 of 2022** about distribution of the sub-sector of investment activities in the health sector within the geographical scope of each of sectors (A) and (B) in accordance with the attached tables in the decree.
- **Prime Minister Decree No. 4427 of 2022** on the addition of a new item, which is the research centers and approval laboratories related to the automotive industry to both Tables (1) and (2) attached to Prime Minister's Decree No. 104 of 2022,
- **Prime Minister Decree No. 983 of 2022:** According to this Decree, GAFI will handle coordination with all ministries and entities relevant to the investment subsectors falling within the geographical territory of Sectors (A) and (B) set out in Article (11) of the Investment Law. It is worth mentioning that as in application of Article (13) of the Investment Law, Prime Minister issued decrees classifying investment activities and projects qualified to receive additional incentives into subsectors falling within the geographical territory of Sectors (A) and (B). By these decrees, certain investment projects will be recommended for being granted additional incentives befitting their nature.
- **Forming the Golden License Unit:** which grants companies incorporated to launch strategic or national projects contributing to development a comprehensive approval (Golden License) encompassing all permits and licenses required for setting up, operating, and managing the company's project.
- **Prime Minister Decree No. 56 of 2022** on Setting out the Terms and Conditions for classifying any Investment Project as Strategic or National in the application of the provision of Article (20) of the Investment Law No. 72 of 2017, which accords the Council of Ministers the power to grant a comprehensive approval to companies incorporated to set up certain projects, such Investment Project shall satisfy two or more of the terms and conditions speculated in the Decree, and it must operate in one of the sectors attached to the decree referred to.
- **Prime Minister's Decree No. 2300 of 2022** to amend the Executive Regulations of the Investment Law: The amendments included that a person who applies for the single approval stipulated in Article (20) of the Investment Law is required to take the form of shareholding company or a limited liability company, provided that the issued capital is not less than 20% of the project's investment costs, and the company is obligated to submit an initial feasibility study for the project, a specific time schedule, and a commitment to provide all infrastructure facilities.
- **Investment Law No. 72 of 2017, Amending by Law No. 160 of 2023:** The President of the Republic issued a Republican Decree issuing Law No. 160 of 2023 regarding amending of some provisions of the Investment Law No. 72 of 2017. These amendments aim to enjoy all the Investment Projects governed by the provisions of this Law whether they have been incorporated before or after this Law has come into force and irrespective of the legal framework governing same, enjoy the general incentives stipulated in this law exception being made for Investment Projects set up under the Free Zone Framework, and expanding the granting of special incentives.



## IV. Most Important Procedures of Facilitating Procedures to Investors



The Supreme Investment Council approved 22 decrees in May 2023 to attract and encourage domestic and foreign investment, and overcoming various challenges facing the increase of the private sector.



Putting GAFI's digitalization plan into action, and the launch of electronic incorporation for companies



Issuing the approvals, permits, or licenses necessary for the establishment within 20 business days, and working to reduce this period to 10 business days



Forming the Golden License Unit and the Special Incentives Unit at GAFI

Granting foreign investors, a five-year residence visa that may be renewed so as to facilitate their residence in Egypt, and streamlining investor-related-security- clearance procedures



Launching an updated version of Investment Map website, the website has been redesigned to give an easier access to investment opportunities, and now GAFI adopts the concept of promoting private sector opportunities through its platform



Permitting build-to-own and usufruct options when it comes to allocating industrial lands, while basing the pricing of such land on the value of the utilities

Forming an unit dedicated at the Council of Ministers to solve investors problems, its main task is to coordinate solving and to address expediently any obstacle or complaint related to investment

## I. Investor Service Centers (ISCs)

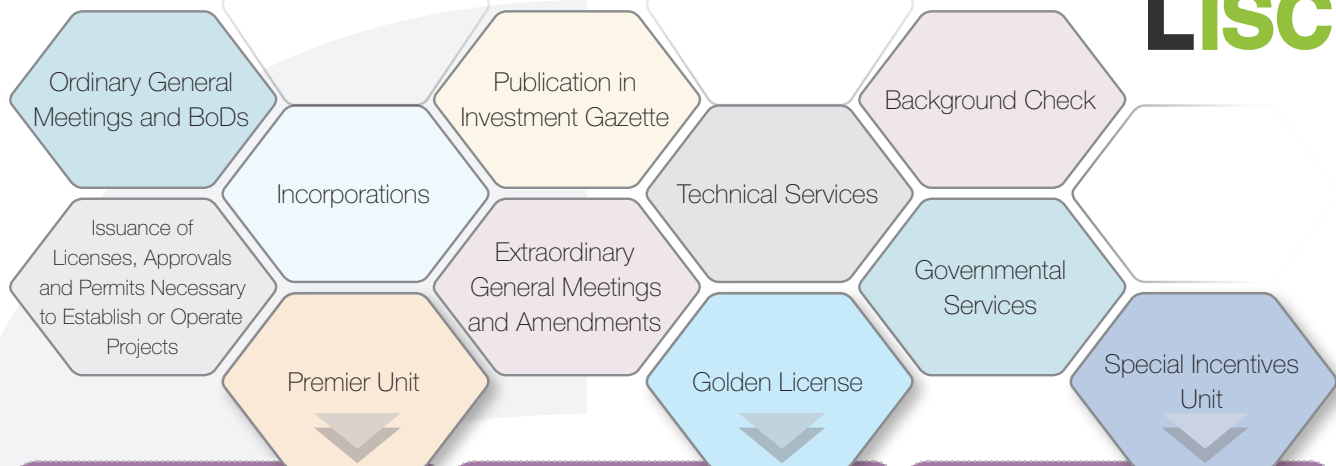
- GAFI has established and developed Investor Service Centers to provide advanced services in line with the provisions of Investment Law No. 72 of 2017 and international standards, including setting a timeframe for the completion of licenses, automating services, applying electronic incorporation procedures, ensuring E-signatures are legally admissible by competent entities, and accepting electronic payment. Such steps are major and necessary to combat corruption, cutting of red tape, and apply the principles of good governance and transparency.
- Within the framework of the geographical spread plan in the governorates, there are currently 14 existing ISCs in Cairo (main center), Giza (6<sup>th</sup> of October), Alexandria, Sharqeiya (10<sup>th</sup> of Ramadan), Ismailia, Port Said, Gamasa, Assiut, Sohag, Menia, South Sinai, Qena, Fayoum, and The New Valley Governorate.
- Work is underway to open ISC in the governorates of Qalyubia.



# GAFI Geographical Scope through Multiple Investment Frameworks



## 1. ISCs Services



The Premier Unit was established to streamline procedures for investors in a short time at the best quality. The unit provides all the services provided at the main ISC, including all the assistance entities needed to approve articles of incorporation.

### The important services provided by the Premier Unit:

- ▶ Incorporating companies of various legal structures: Sole Proprietorships Partnerships - Corporations (same day).
- ▶ Incorporating companies operating under the free zone framework upon the approval of the zones department (48 hours).
- ▶ Ratifying all BoDs and General Meetings (same day).
- ▶ Ratifying Extraordinary General Meetings, mergers, split-ups, change of legal structure, and BoD resolutions increasing the capital of all types of legal structures of companies (same day).
- ▶ Giving recommendations on residence, subordinates, and work permits on the same day, and endorsing residence visa in the passport. (same day).



According to Article (20) of Investment Law enacted by Law No.70 of 2017 and Articles (42) and (43) of its Executive Regulations, the golden license is a comprehensive approval on the set up, operation and management of a project, including building licenses of such project and the allocation of the real property required therefor. It may be granted to companies upon a decree of the Council of Ministers, and this approval may include the application of one or more of the incentives mentioned in the present law to the project, also this approval must be valid on its own without the need to take any other action.

### Companies that may be granted a Golden License (Comprehensive Approval):

- ▶ Companies that are incorporated to set up strategic or national projects that contribute to the achievement of sustainable development in accordance with the State's economic development plan.
- ▶ Companies that are incorporated to set up a partnership between the private sector and the State, the public sector or the public business sector in the activities of (public utilities and infrastructure - new and renewable energy - roads and transportation - ports - telecommunications and information technology).



The unit was established within GAFI's keenness to put the special incentives framework into effect because it is closely related to stimulating investments in areas, activities, sectors and regions that serve the economic development plan, to increasing production rates, and to providing job opportunities.

### Special Incentives Unit Functions:

- ▶ Receiving applications for obtaining special incentives in accordance to Article No. 11 of Investment Law No. 72 of 2017, and Article No. 10 of its Executive Regulations.
- ▶ Assessing applications of companies and establishments requesting special incentives and verifying whether such companies/establishment are committed and have submitted all required documents.
- ▶ Reviewing the status of companies and establishments whose commencement date has been determined, to assess compliance.
- ▶ Taking the necessary measures to obtain a certificate of enjoyment of special incentives and following up on its process.




## 2. Steps of Company Incorporations through ISCs

### A. Incorporation through the electronic portal

- Register and create an account on the electronic portal [www.gafinet.gov.eg](http://www.gafinet.gov.eg), and the documents be reviewed by GAFI.
- Pay fees using credit cards and sign documents electronically.
- Submit all company documents to the online portal.



### B. Incorporation at ISCs

## II: Free Zones (Public – Private)

Free zones in Egypt are considered a distinct investment pattern, as they are one of the investment systems that are governed by Investment Law No. 72 of 2017 and its Executive Regulations, and whose implementation is supervised by GAFI. The law allows to establish all projects designated to the free zones in accordance with the policy set by GAFI, mainly export-oriented industries, with the exception of some industries.

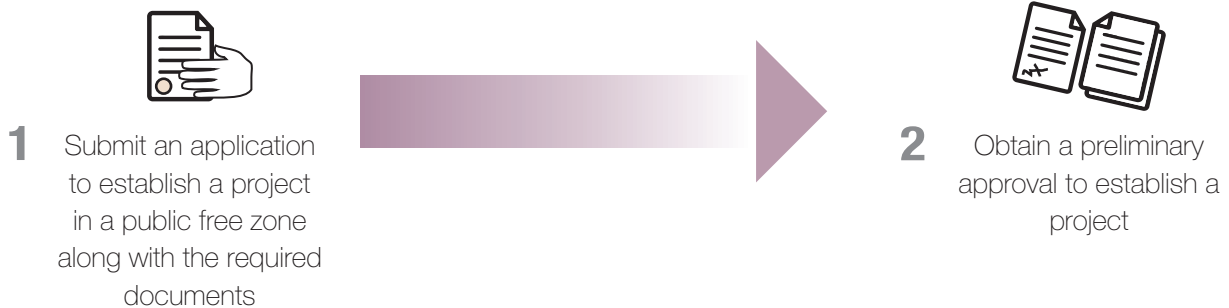

### 1- Public Free Zones

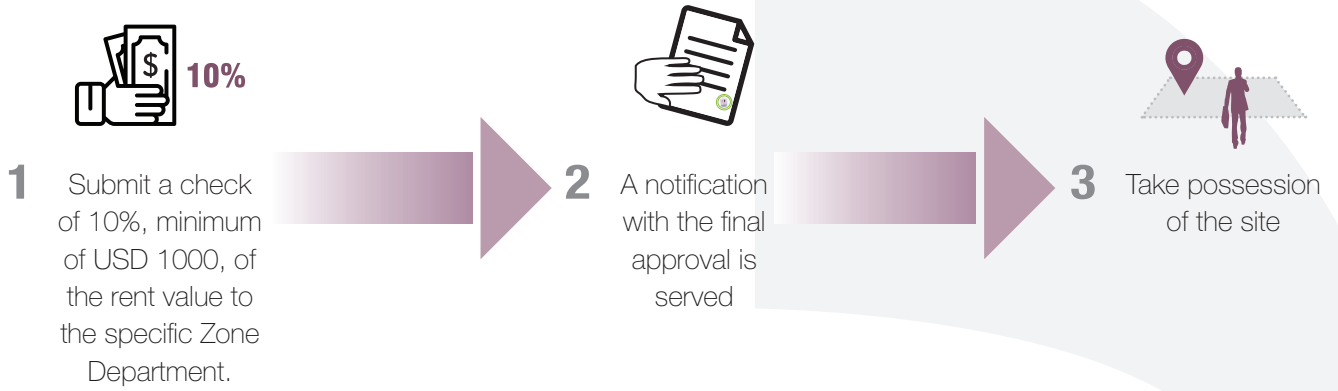
There are 9 public free zones spread across the country that include all necessary facilities and infrastructure to operate and receive projects, in addition to an integrated customs unit and a port security police unit. Free zones sites were specifically selected to be located in major cities that are location-distinguished, labor-abundance, high capabilities that support the free zone, and adjacent to seaports and airports.

## 2- Private Free Zones

It is a single entity represents one independent project (or more than one project with similar activities) that its nature necessitates to be established outside the public free zones due to the project economies and type of activity that requires to be established in certain locations in order to benefit from the site advantages in terms of proximity to raw materials and production requirements, export markets, labor, integration with nearby projects, or proximity to specific port or road.

### ■ Standards and regulations of establishing a private free zone in accordance with Investment Law No. 72 of 2017:



There is no location appropriate for the project activity within the public free zone.



The project takes the form of a joint stock company or a limited liability company.



The project issued capital should not be less than 10 million dollars and its investment costs shall not be less than 20 million dollars.



Permanent labour in industrial projects should not be less than 500 workers; in some strategic projects of special importance, exceptions to the required number can be made.

The project area should not be less than 20 thousand square meters.

The local component percentage should not be less than 30%.



The percentage of exports outside the country should not be less than 80%. An exception to this percentage may be made in the case of strategic projects of special importance.



Private free zone projects shall abide by industrial security and civil defense controls.



The final approval on setting up the project shall be null and void, should the investor fail to demonstrate seriousness in implementing the project within 6 months from the date the investor was notified with the project approval; however, this period may be extended for another in light of the justifications provided by the stakeholders and deemed acceptable by the respective Free Zone BoD at its discretion.

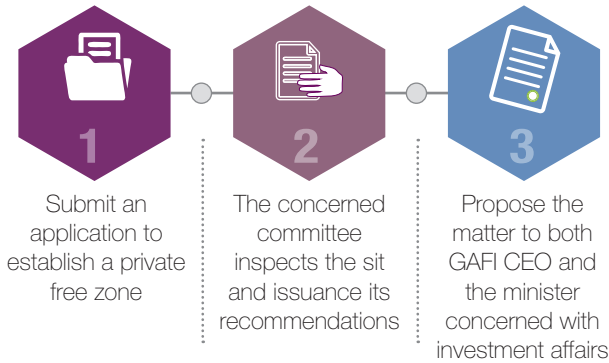

A sub-file for the project is to be prepared and submitted to the incorporation unit at Investors Service Center to commence the incorporation procedures and GAFI CEO shall issue a decree licensing to establish the company, and to serve a notice to the central administration of the private free zones of the decree after being approved.

## III: Investment Zones

The investment zones are one of the investment types that are based on the integrated development system in various fields, including industrial, commercial, service, logistics and other activities. It provides lands and industrial units fully equipped through developers specialized in the field of industrial development to raise the burden of providing facilities from the State and achieves integrated development in various fields.

Investment zones provide one administrative entity, through GAFI, that issue all necessary approvals, licenses and permits to investors within those areas with easy procedures.

Each investment zone shall have a board of directors, which is concerned with developing the zone's business plan, setting up the regulations and controls necessary for the exercise of the activity and obtaining approval on these controls from GAFI BoD; as well as it approves the establishment of investment projects within the boundaries of the zone, and such projects shall be governed by all principles, guarantees and investment incentives.

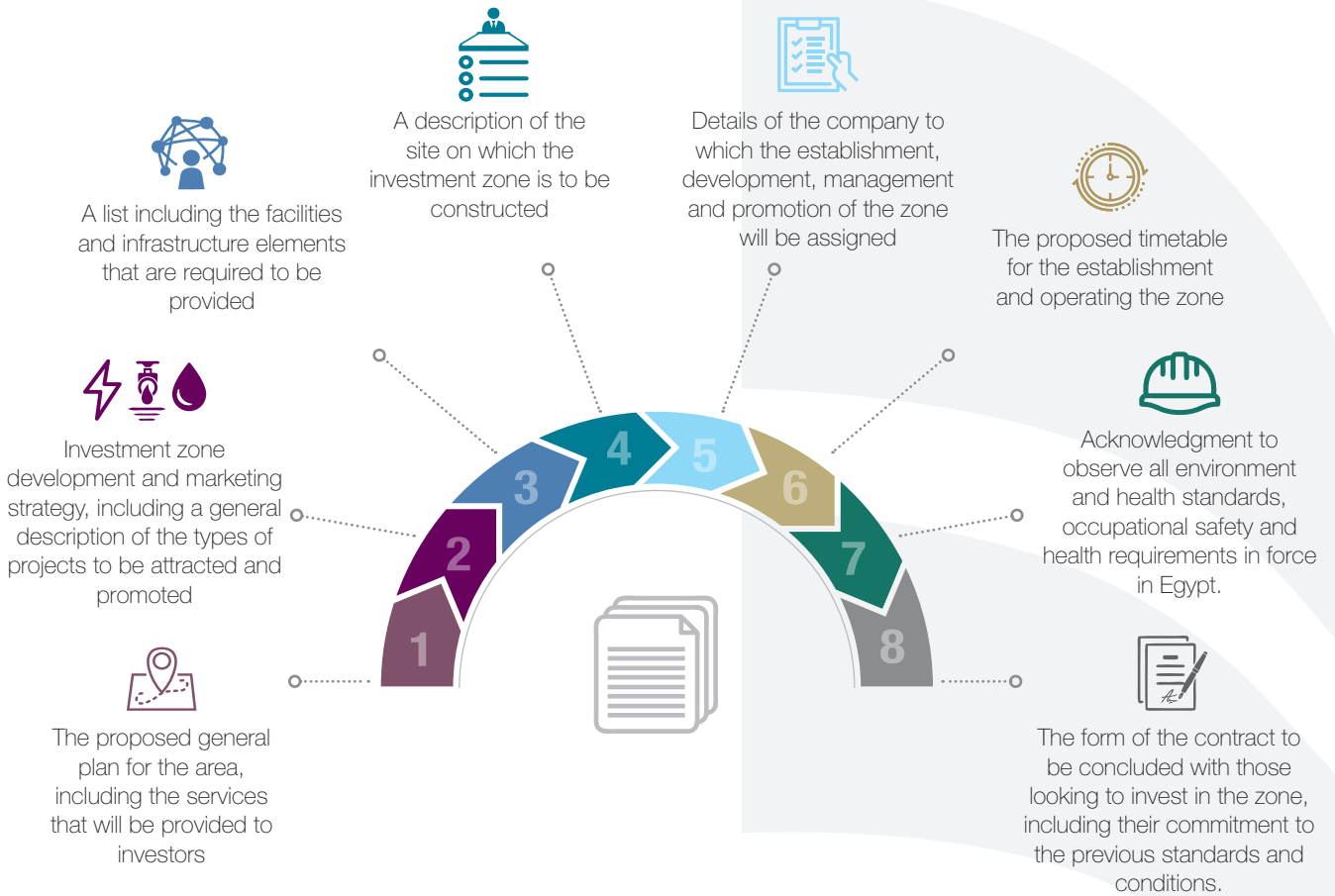

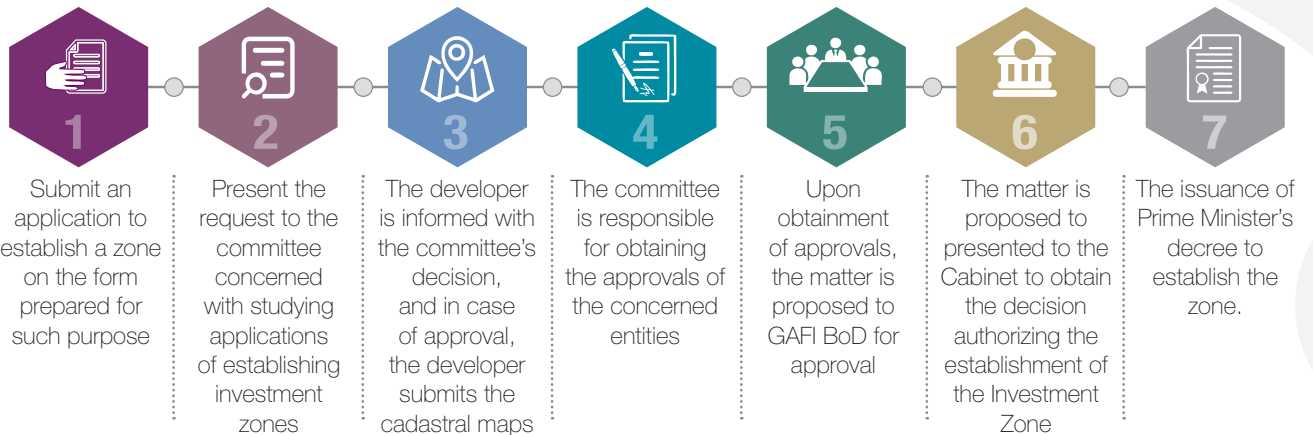

### Leading Economic Sectors in Egypt

The economic reform policies set by Egypt has succeeded in achieving growth rates, despite the negative repercussions of the successive global crises and their impact on the global economy as a whole, including the Egyptian economy. However, the Egyptian economy has succeeded in dealing with these crises through a set of procedures and measures aimed at alleviating the severity of such crises and preserving the gains achieved by the first phase of the Economic Reform Program.

The economic structure of Egypt is characterized by diversity and a flexible response to market forces and its interactions, which constitutes a strong basis for the positive contribution of all economic sectors to the process of economic growth. The sustainable development plan in Egypt gives priority to the leading, high- productivity, fast-growing sectors that provide more job opportunities, at the forefront of which are the manufacturing industries, agriculture, communications and information technology, construction and building, transportation, communications and tourism, in addition to sectors with a social dimension such as education and health.



# Leading Economic Sectors in Egypt

## I: Selection Criteria of Targeted Economic Sectors with a Competitive Advantage in Egypt

There are number of criterias that are used to determine the sectors that the State aims to promote in order to attract more local and foreign investments to invest in such sectors. These criteria are as follows:



According to the above-mentioned criteria, the sectors of industry, agriculture, transportation and logistics, construction and building, communications and information technology, health care, and education are among the most important sectors that are promoted in Egypt. In addition to the tourism sector due to its ability to recover after the end of the global crises, and its importance in attracting more foreign investment.



## II: The Most Important Economic Sectors Targeted For Promotion in Egypt

### Industry Sector

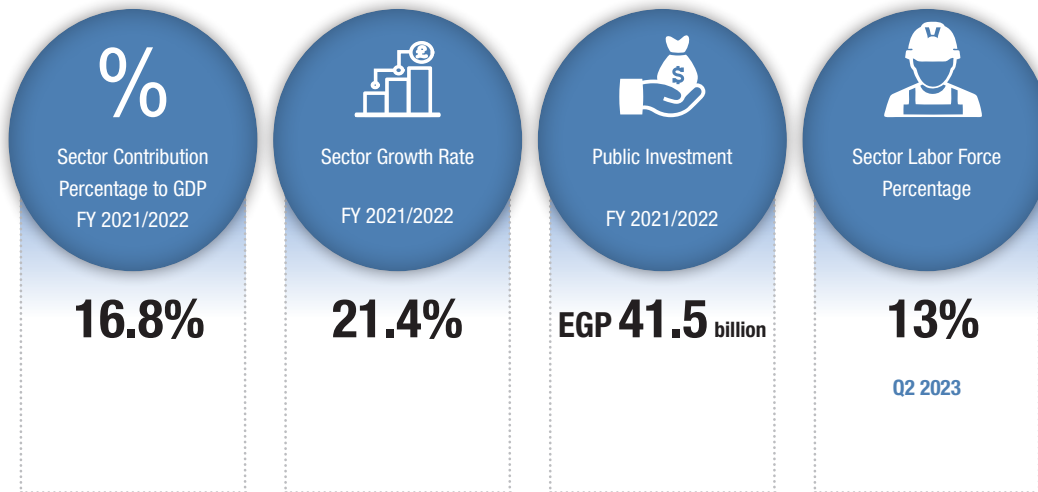
#### A- Sector Overview

The industry sector is the main starting point of any society that aims to make a real development boom, due to the importance of the sector and its interconnected relationship with many other productive and service sectors in the society. Moreover, it has a role in the development of foreign trade, and its ability to provide several and varied job opportunities, and attract more foreign investment.

Industry plays an important and decisive role in the development process. Successful growth stories are in which major amounts of investment flows are directed to sectors which are capable of creating new job opportunities, or adding real value to the national economy.

The great efforts exerted by the government, with the support and guidance of the political leadership, have resulted in the adoption of many initiatives, enhancing the national industry, and its support through bold measures and decisions that have contributed to alleviate the severity of the COVID-19 spread, and preserving the rates of production and exports to various foreign markets.

## C- Key Developments of the Sector



■ Egypt possesses all the industrial components that qualify it for regional and continental leadership; it has abundant raw materials, highly qualified human resources, and traditional and renewable energy sources. Moreover, the State's policy (legislative and procedural packages) create a more favorable environment for industrial investments.



■ The President of the Republic approved a package of new industrial incentives aimed at boosting domestic manufacturing. These incentives are expected to attract investments in the field of production requirements; assist in meeting local demand on strategic goods, especially pharmaceuticals; and attract advanced global industrial technologies to the Egyptian market. In addition to reduce the trade deficit and the depletion of the USD reserves by providing local alternatives; and assist in increasing exports and employment rates.



■ According to a Cooperation Protocol signed between the Ministry of Planning and Economic Development (MoPED), Ministry of Trade and Industry (MoTI), and a company engaged in the business of financial institutions operational technology named "e-Finance Group", a digital platform called "Egypt's Digital Industrial Platform" has been established in 2022. This platform aims at facilitating the provision of various digital services and procedures to investors in the industrial sector and expediting the completion of the required procedures by developing a digital system.



■ The Golden License, an all-inclusive approval granted to strategic projects in the industrial sector, has become completely operational.



■ Currently, the Government exerts its best efforts to implement effectively the incentives of Investment Law 72/2017 including tax, non-tax and additional incentives such as the green incentives, and the automotive incentives.



■ A national program for boosting domestic manufacturing has been launched. Its objectives are to (i) improve the competitiveness of Egyptian industry, (ii) replace imported products, and (iii) develop the local supply base.



■ A package of unprecedented procedures has been issued to facilitate small investors' obtainment of units in specialized industrial complexes.



■ Industrial lands are currently being offered for possession in return for usufruct fees in the same prices of utilities. A clear mechanism for pricing industrial lands has been set. Industrial Development Authority (IDA) provided industrial investors with a package of new facilities.



■ During the period from July 2014 to June 2023, 17 industrial complexes were established in 15 governorates, with a total capacity of 5,046 industrial units. The construction of these industrial parks has been completed by 100%.



■ During 2022/23, about 613 projects were approved, compared to about 77 projects during the previous year, with a growth rate of 696%. During 2022/23, about 936 plots of land were allocated, compared to 150 plots of land during the year 2021/22, with a growth rate of 524%.



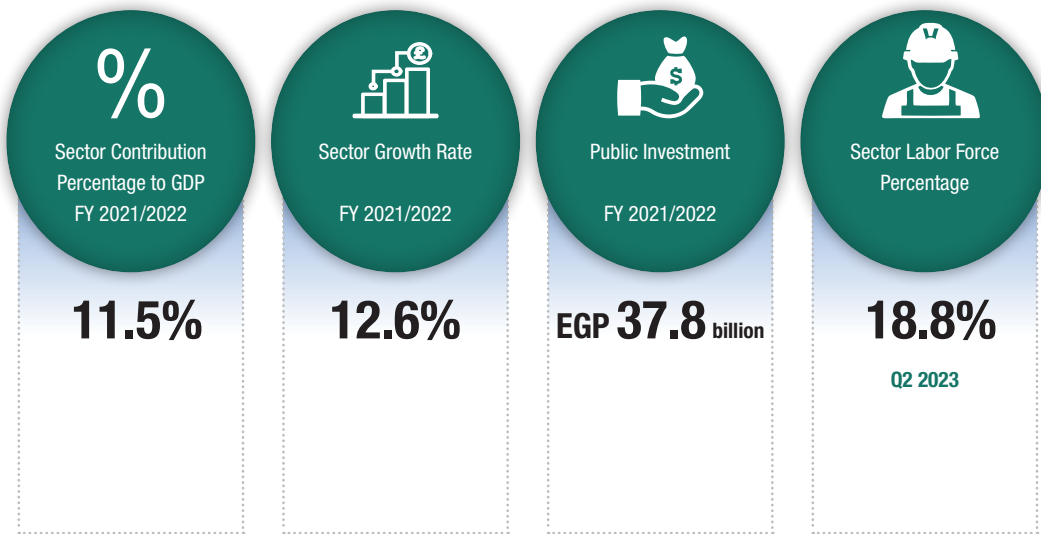
■ The development and revision of documentary cycle for the procedures of issuing "Operating License" and granting the "Industrial License" for investors within a maximum of 20 days as per the prior-approval system and 1-7 day(s) as per the approval-notice system. In 2022/23 about 307 licenses were granted under the approval-notice system and 198 under the prior-approval system.



## A- Sector Overview

The agricultural sector is considered a major source of achieving food security, providing strategic and export crops. It gains special importance due to its interconnection with other sectors in the country, in addition to being a labor-intensive sector, and it represents the main source of the industrial sector inputs. In light of the State's strategy to improve this sector, efforts have been exerted to develop agricultural methods, improve productivity by relying on modern technologies, use of digital and vital technology to achieve development, and achieve the highest economic benefit internally and externally.

## C- Key Developments in the Sector



Egypt adopted the "Decent Life" Initiative to rehabilitate rural areas through one of the largest social protection programs, which aims to reach more than 50% of Egypt's population, modernize rural infrastructure, and provide basic and social services to about 4,700 villages.



The Government increased the use of technological applications in modern agriculture and paid attention to smart agriculture and digitization programs. It also focused on agricultural industrialization as a means to increase added value, maximize the use of natural resources, encourage investments in the agricultural sector, and turn foreign direct investments (FDI) into a financing resource to local development and to ensuring food security.



To strengthen self-sufficiency and reduce the agricultural gap, the Government engaged into projects reclaiming new barren lands known as the horizontal expansion. Among the horizontal expansion projects are Toshka Project established on a surface area of 1.1 million Feddans; the New Delta Mega Project on a surface area of 2.2 million Feddans; the North and Central Sinai Development Project on a surface area of 456 thousand Feddans; and the Egyptian Rural Development Project on a surface area of 1.5 million Feddans.



Contract farming has been effectively implemented in order to encourage farmers to farm, ensure a remunerative return from the cultivated crops, protect the farmers' rights and financial entitlements, and provide technical support as well as production requirements to farmers of such crops.



The Ministry of Agriculture and Land Reclamation adopted the vegetable crops seeds production program with the aim of increasing Egypt's ability to provide vegetable seeds locally instead of importing more than 95% of vegetable crop seeds. In addition, the program aims at reducing the burden on farmer by making such seeds available at appropriate prices while limiting imports from abroad in order to save foreign exchange.



The national initiative to develop and modernize the irrigation system has been launched on an area of one million feddans in the new lands and on an area of about 3.7 million feddans in the old lands. In addition, the expansion of cultivation of crop varieties with low water requirements has been supported, and the water-saving agricultural practices have been implemented.



The expand of the digital transformation and smart agriculture system by launching many digital services (20 services), completing the farmer card system, and launching the agriculture E-platform.



A strategy was adopted to double the area of wheat-cultivated lands, and increase self-sufficiency in wheat, while adopting modern technologies to enhance productivity and reduce water use, and launching the national project to develop sugarcane.



In accordance with the Food Economic Outlook report issued by the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), Egypt produces 30% of the net production of agricultural crops in the Middle East and North Africa region.

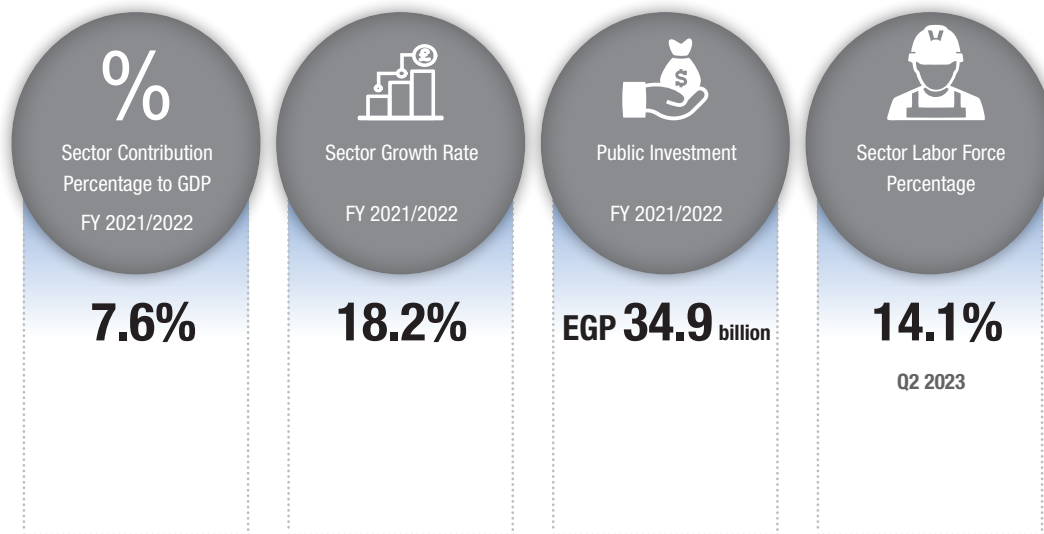

## A- Sector Overview

Construction and building sector is considered one of the most important economic sectors that reflect the progress of countries. The sector has succeeded in achieving positive growth rates during the past four years in order to be able to protect the Egyptian economy in times of crisis, as it achieved high growth and operation rates supported by a breakthrough in the national projects that adopted by President. Comes at the top of the national projects: Suez Canal project, National Road Project, and a number of huge real estate projects such as New Administrative Capital, New Alamein, and New Mansoura, which contributed to the return of activity to the construction and building sector.

## C- Key Developments in the Sector



The importance of the construction sector has increased and it has become one of the most influential sectors in the Egyptian economy during the recent period, as Egypt ranked the second strongest market in the Middle East and North Africa region.



The construction sector enjoys high competitive advantages represented in the availability of high-quality natural raw materials from quarries and mining materials, and the availability of production capacities that cover local and international needs.



The construction sector achieved the highest performance rates in the past two years, as the sector's growth rate increased to 11%, and its contribution to the gross domestic product increased by 18.7% of the total contribution of the Egyptian industry.



A report about the future prospects of the construction sector in Egypt issued by the American Agency "Fitch" indicated that there are positive indicators for the sector in the medium and long term as a result of the increasing demand for infrastructure through the expansion of the economy, the increase of population, the government's commitment to financing infrastructure, and the financing increase of partnership between the public and private sectors.



Fitch also expected the construction sector in Egypt to expand by 6.8% on an annual basis during the year 2023, followed by an average annual growth of 7.4% between 2024 and 2027. Moreover, the expectations indicate that Egypt will witness a greater role for private capital, especially in light of the partnership framework between the public and private sectors.

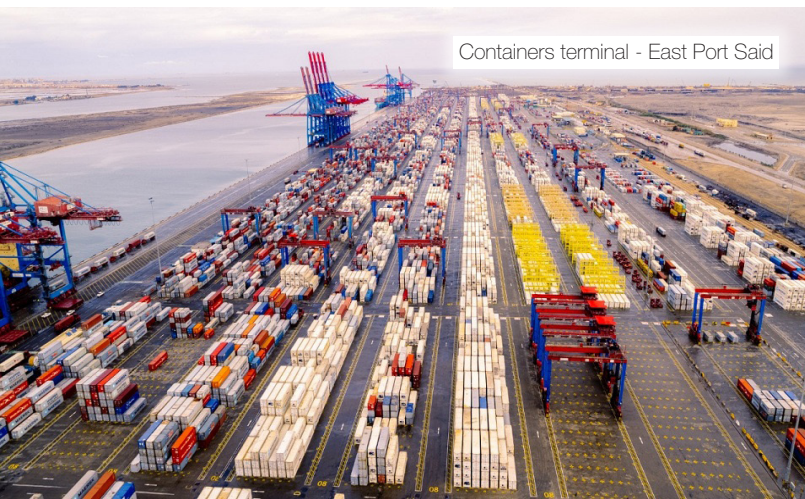
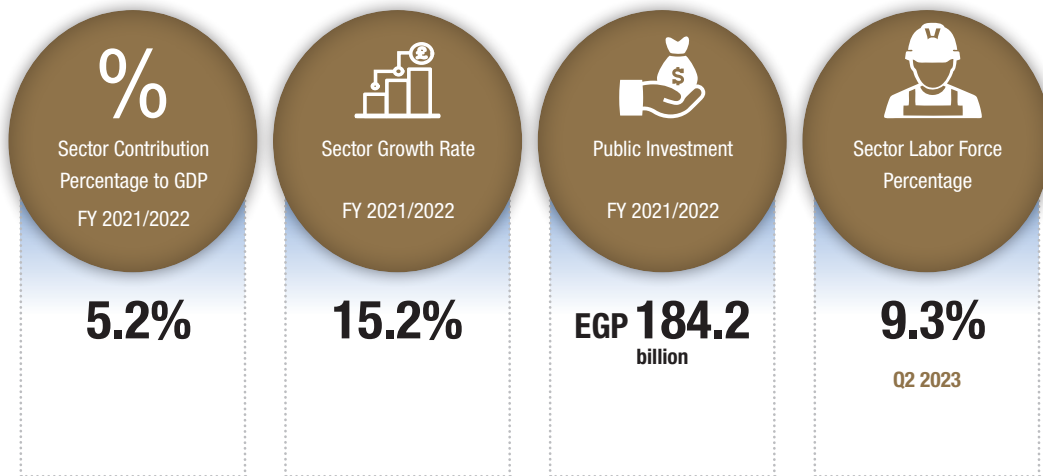
## A- Sector Overview

The transportation sector in Egypt is considered one of the most important service and vital sectors in the country, which is closely and directly linked to all other economic and social sectors. transportation networks are the backbone of development programs. Countries economies and their growth rates are affected by the efficiency of various transportation networks and means.

Egypt is implementing an integrated strategy to develop the transportation framework through a clear plan that includes all transportation sectors such as (roads and bridges - railways - Metro - maritime transportation - river transportation - dry ports and logistics - air transportation). This strategy is consistent with the State vision of sustainable development until 2030, and achieving interdependence and complementarity among them, with the development of specific and precise mechanisms to follow up on their correct implementation.

The Egyptian State also gives special importance to the transportation sector and its projects within its ambitious strategy to provide and integrate the various transportation networks and means to serve the comprehensive development process, and to achieve a balance between social, economic and environmental requirements. In addition to achieving a breakthrough in the level of services provided to citizens, and providing the highest standards of safety and security, as well as facilitating the movement of commercial transportation and stimulating the investment environment. These achievements have been reflected into the implementation of a number of important and huge projects in accordance with the latest international standards and advanced technology.

## C- Key Developments in the Sector



- The implementation of the development plan of roads and bridges by constructing 7,000 km of new roads, in addition to raising the efficiency of 10,000 km of the current roads network.



- A project to develop the railway network through establishing new railway lines and developing new means of transportation, in addition to developing of about 10000 km of the existing railway lines, in addition to developing the human resources.



- The light Rail Transit (LRT) project, which represents a safe mean of transportation that does not pollute the environment, and connects the New Administrative Capital with the governorates of Cairo and Giza and the downtown area, with a total of about 103 km and 19 stations.



- The High Speed Rail (HSR) project, which connects the New Administrative Capital and the new cities with the railway network to facilitate the transportation of passengers and goods, with a total of about 2000 km and 60 stations.



- Monorail project, which contributes to saving fuel consumption and environmental pollution rates, includes the New Administrative Capital monorail project "East Nile Monorail" with a length of 56.5 km and 22 stations, and 6th of October monorail project "West Nile Monorail" with a length of 42 km and 12 stations.



- Cairo Metro development project, which includes raising the efficiency of the first and second lines "Line 1 and 2" with lengths of 44 km and 22 km, completing the implementation of the third line "Line 3" with a length of 41.2 km, constructing the fourth line "Line 4" (6th of October - New Cairo) with a length of 42 km, as well as constructing the sixth line "Line 6" ( al-Khosous - New Maadi) with a length of 35 km.



- Bus Rapid Transit "BRT" project is being implemented on the Ring Road with the aim of using a distinct and environment-friendly means of passenger transportation, and it includes 47 Stations.



- Launch Egypt Maritime Transport Strategy 2030, which aims to raise the international classification of Egyptian seaports and transform them into green ports that use renewable energy sources.



- Establish East Port Said port "EPS port", which is the first green port on the continent. The port is distinguished from others by applying technology that reduces pollution rates according to the commodities nature, and has isolated areas for unclean casting to reduce its hazardous effects on the environment.



- Adly Mansour Central Interchange Station project won the 2022 Global Best Projects Awards in category of "Best Project Rail/Transit", according to the evaluation of the international Engineering News-Record "ENR magazine", where the award is given to the best and most influential projects according to their positive contribution to society and the environment.

- Egypt advanced six ranks in the "Market Access and Infrastructure" in the Legatum Prosperity Index Which measures the quality of infrastructure that enables the flow of trade into and from international partners, reaching 85th in 2021 compared to 91st in 2019.



- Egypt advanced seven ranks in "Agility Emerging Markets Logistics" Index, as the index is based on evaluating logistics opportunities, availability of business basics, and digital readiness, bringing it to the 21st rank in 2022 compared to the 28th rank in 2014.

- Egypt advanced 100 places in "Road Quality" Index issued by World Economic Forum, which measures the efficiency, safety and width of roads, to occupy the 18th rank in 2021, compared to the 118th rank in 2015.

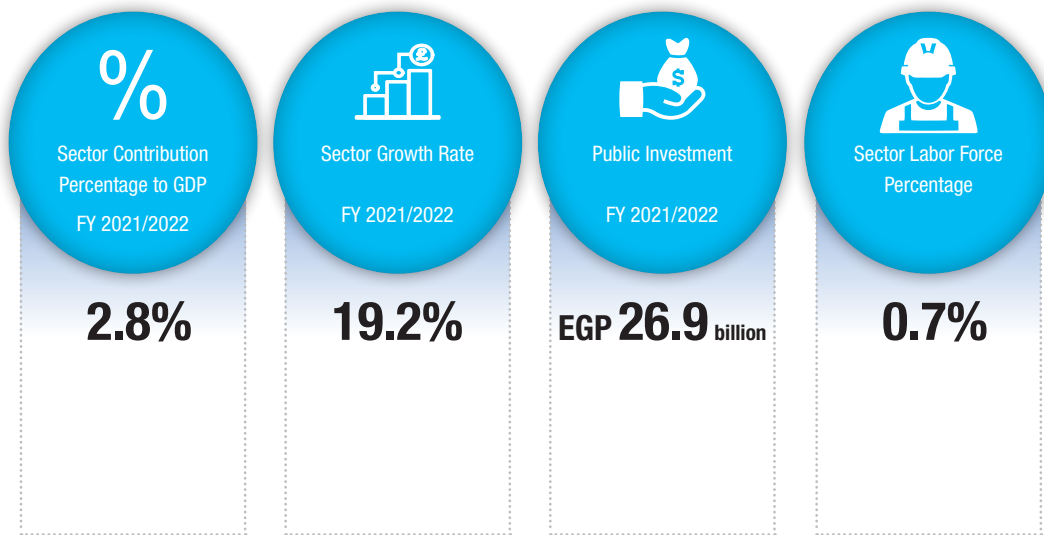
- Egypt advanced 31 ranks in "Airport Infrastructure" index issued by the World Economic Forum, which measures the adequacy of airport connectivity and ease of access to and from many countries, to occupy the 32nd place in 2021 compared to the 63rd place in 2015.

## C- Key Developments in the Sector



The Ministry of Communications and Information Technology has achieved significant progress within the process of implementing Egypt's Digital Strategy, through which it aims to adopt the latest international technology, support innovative thinking to create an integrated digital society and enrich the capacity-building of the Egyptian citizen, develop State sectors, and enhance Egypt's position on the map of the communications and information technology industry.



Launch Egypt's Digital Strategy for Offshoring Industry 2022-2026, with the participation of more than 120 international and local companies, and in the presence of a wide range of CEOs, leaders of specialized companies and outsourcing service providers. The strategy aims to triple the volume of exports of cross-border IT products and services, provide a new incentive package to attract investments, and enhance Egypt's competitiveness in the areas of research, development and value-added services, thus contributing to accelerating the growth of the knowledge economy.



Egypt's rank moves up in "Digital Government Readiness " index for 2022, issued by the world bank, as it was classified with rank (A), among the group of leading countries in digital government; which is the highest category in the index, compared to rank (B) in 2020, and rank (C) in 2018.



Egypt's rank moved up in the "Global Innovation Index", as it ranked 89th globally in 2022 compared to 94th in 2021, according to the report of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) in partnership with the Portland Institute.



Egypt's rank moved up 4 places in the network readiness index issued by Portland Institute to reach the 73rd place in 2022 compared to the 77th place in 2021.



Egypt won the Speedtest Awards for the fastest fixed country in Africa presented by Ookla, which is the global leader in measuring and assessing internet speeds.

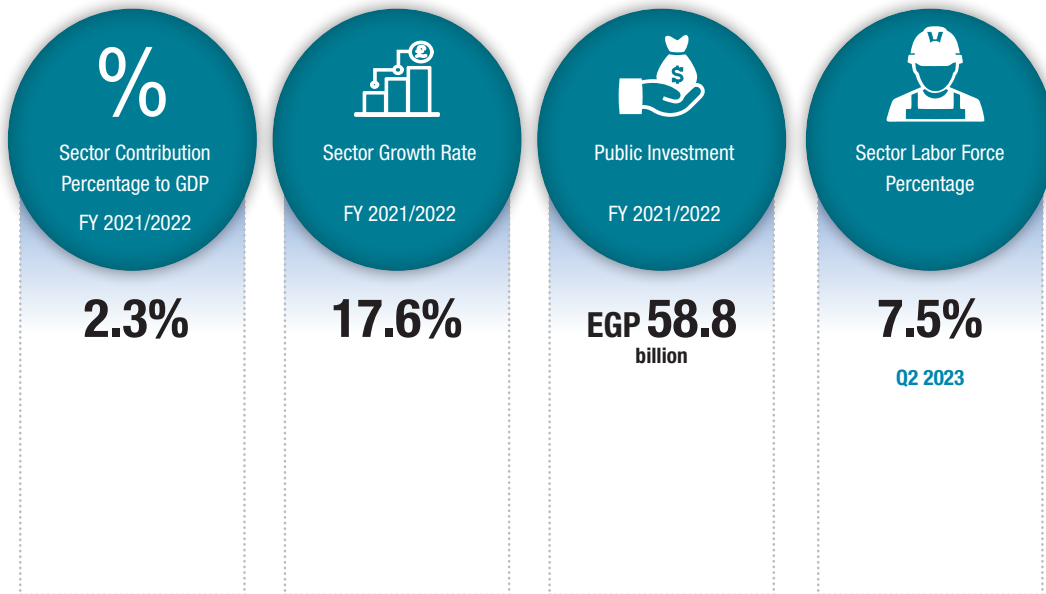




**A- Sector Overview**

The education sector is one of the most important element of the State's investment plan, and one of the most important pillars of Egypt Vision 2030 and the sustainable development plan. It is also considered one of the sectors that come at the forefront of the human development sectors. It plays an important role in the economic development process, by contributing to the labor market supply with qualified labor force that will enhance the competitiveness of the national economy, as education has various implications in the plan to build people, reduce unemployment rates at the graduate level. Moreover, it supports the State's orientation and investment plan that is based on human development mainly.

### C- Key Developments in the Sector



- School buildings were technologically equipped in 552 thousand classrooms, as during the period from 2014 to 2023, 120 thousand classrooms were built, more than 9,246 computer labs and 36,210 smart screens were developed, and fiber networks were used to provide internet connection to 2,476 schools. Furthermore, school curricula, up to the sixth grade, were developed, with a total of 49 curricula.



- An ambitious strategy to reform and develop the technical education was launched, including the improvement of the technical education quality through establishing an independent authority for quality assurance and accreditation (Itqan), and the transformation of school curricula into curricula based on competency methodology.



- Applied technology schools were launched, in partnership with the private sector, in a number of specializations, the most important of which are electrical maintenance, surveillance and alarm, programming and web design, artificial intelligence technology, and jewelry manufacturing technology. Such schools apply international standards in teaching and training methods.



- The number of technical education schools was increased by 84.6%, reaching 3,114 schools in 2022/2023 compared to 1,687 schools in 2013/2014, in addition to an increase in the number of technical education students by 53.3%, reaching 2.3 million students in 2022/2023 compared to about 1.5 million students in 2013/2014.



- Technological universities were established to keep pace with the needs of the local, regional and international labor market. Such universities are an extension of the path of technical education students and work to provide them with the practical and scientific skills in 17 specializations.



- The higher education and scientific research system is being developed, in addition to linking scientific research to the needs and priorities of the State's plan and sustainable development goals (Egypt Vision 2030). The National Strategy for Higher Education and Scientific Research was launched, based on three main axes, which are: the sustainable development strategy (Egypt Vision 2030), the shift towards fourth generation universities, and linking the higher education and scientific research system to Egypt's comprehensive development plan.



- "Be Ready" Initiative was launched to train youth and fresh graduates for the labor market, in cooperation with the International Labor Organization (ILO) in Cairo and the British Agency for International Development (UKAID), in addition to the cooperation with the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), to establish university centers for career development with the aim of providing career counseling services to millions of students.



- The number of public colleges was increased from 338 colleges in 2014 to 443 colleges in 2023, in addition to increasing the number of private colleges from 118 colleges in 2014 to 253 colleges in 2023.



- The rank of pre-university education in Egypt moved up in international rankings, as Egypt's rank in the Global Knowledge Index moved up from the 83rd place in 2020 to the 79th place in 2023.

- Egypt moved up 32 places in the "Technical and Vocational Education and Training" indicator issued by United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), to occupy the 81st place in 2022 compared to the 113th place in 2017, in addition to moving up 30 places in UNDP continuing training index to occupy the 98th place in 2022 compared to the 128th place in 2017.



- Egypt advanced 42 places in the index of the relevance of education system and the economy issued by European Institute of Business Administration, to occupy 75th place in 2022, compared to 117th place in 2017. Moreover, INSEAD announced that Egypt advanced 38 places in the index of "Ease of Finding Skilled Labor" to occupy 30th place in 2022 compared to the 68th rank in 2017.

- Egypt advanced 19 places in the "Higher Education" index issued by the UNDP, which depends on several sub-pillars, including spending on education and the quality of universities, where it occupied the 35th place in 2021, compared to the 54th place in 2017.

- Egypt advanced 14 places in the Education Quality Index issued by US News, which ranks the best educational systems, as Egypt ranked 37th in 2022 compared to 51st in 2019.

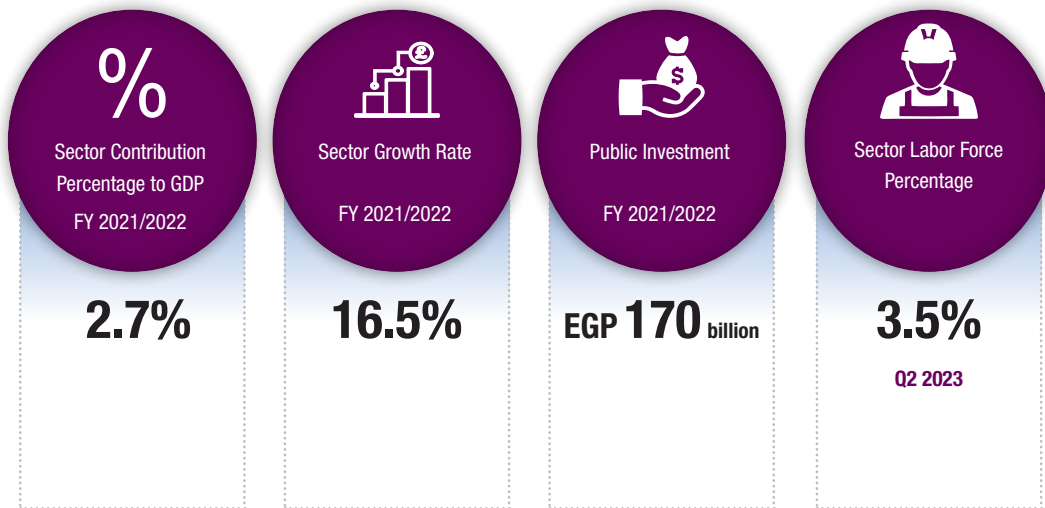


**A- Sector Overview**

Among the key incentives to invest in this sector are the large population of Egypt, the comprehensive health insurance project that is currently being implemented, the available medical practitioners meeting the required qualifications, and the competitive pricing of the medical services compared to other countries.

### C- Key Developments in the Sector



The President's initiative to eliminate Virus C and detect non-communicable diseases (NCD) (100 Million Health). The American Forbes magazine praised Egypt's success in eliminating Virus C through the (100 Million Health) campaign.



More than 6 million citizens were covered under the comprehensive health insurance system, and more than 28 million services were provided, with a total cost of EGP 51.2 billion, through 362 facilities in 6 governorates in the first phase.



The self-sufficiency initiative in plasma derivatives, in partnership between the Egyptian government and Grifols, the global leader in the field of plasma-derived medicines, with a capital of \$300 million, aiming to support the health system in achieving self-sufficiency in plasma derivatives and export them.



Launching the National Health and Development Strategy (2023-2030). The most important pillars of this strategy are as follows:

- Strengthening health systems towards comprehensive health coverage and enhancing access to quality basic health services in accordance with international standards through **expansion of the comprehensive health insurance system**.
- **"Enhancing health and well-being"** by strengthening health systems to ensure everyone's access to quality health services, enhancing health services for the elderly, improving the quality of life, and reducing all forms of malnutrition during the different phases of life.
- **"Disease prevention and control"** by reducing the burden of non-communicable diseases (NCD) and strengthening surveillance systems.
- **"Enhancing prevention, preparedness and response to health security"** by strengthening and supporting the resilience of the health system by supporting preparedness for health emergencies, supporting prevention and response to them at all levels, in addition to enhancing national, regional and global health security.
- **Promoting health equity, governance, leadership and accountability** by strengthening and developing leadership capabilities.
- **Promoting innovation in the field of digital health** for comprehensive health coverage.



Inking a number of cooperation protocols between the Ministry of Health and Population (MoHP) and a number of pharmaceutical companies:

- Inking a cooperation protocol with « **Sanofi** » in the field of genetic and rare diseases to support the State efforts in the field of reducing genetic diseases; through increasing public awareness, changing behaviors, and raising awareness of rare genetic diseases.
- Inking a cooperation protocol with « **AstraZeneca** » Egypt for pharmaceutical industries to support the presidential initiative for the early detection and treatment of cancerous tumors (lung cancer).
- Inking a cooperation protocol with « **Merck Ltd.** » Egypt to support the presidential initiative for the early detection of cancerous tumors (colon cancer).



Sharm El Sheikh International Hospital received the international recognition certificate from the Global Green and Healthy Hospitals "GGHH", and the national accreditation of the General Authority for Healthcare Accreditation and Regulation "GAHAR" recognized by the International Society for Quality in Healthcare "ESCWA", as the first hospital in Egypt to receive this certificate.



The World Bank delegation praised the remarkable progress of the healthcare sector in Egypt. The delegation explained that the comprehensive health insurance system ensures the efficiency of infrastructure and medical and non-medical supplies for health facilities, the quality of medical services, and the reinforcement of governance systems, which ensures the sustainability of the system's ability to provide comprehensive healthcare to citizens efficiently.

**C- Key Developments in the Sector**



The national strategy to support and develop tourism in Egypt aims to achieve rapid growth ranging between 25% to 30% annually in this field, through the optimal exploitation of the State's tourism, natural, human and archaeological resources, ensuring their sustainability, and providing a distinguished and advanced infrastructure and services to increase Egypt's competitiveness.



This strategy also aims to achieve the target number of tourists arriving from various global markets and reach 30 million tourists in 2028.



Tourism sector plan aims to intensify tourism promotion activities and apply new promotional tools to enhance the product against the intense competition from other tourist destinations, through a number of important pillars that the Egyptian government has worked on, on top of which is strengthening the marketing and advertising message abroad through effective implementation of the international promotional campaign that was agreed upon with major specialized companies.

Egypt advanced 20 places in the "Security and Safety" index for expatriates issued by "Intentions", which measures personal safety and security as part of quality of life, as Egypt ranked 42nd in 2022, compared to 62nd in 2016.

Egypt advanced 7 places in the US News Heritage Index, which evaluates historical, geographic, and cultural attractions. Egypt ranked 6th in 2022, compared to 13th in 2016.



"Travel Inside" magazine chose Egypt as the first in the world among the most desired tourist destinations during the current period, surpassing many other tourist destinations.

According to the "Lonely Planet" travel guide, Egypt was chosen among the top 10 tourist destinations to visit in 2022, as well as being chosen among the five best tourist destinations in Africa, according to the "Financial Times".

Egypt advanced 32 places in the Travel & Tourism Development Index of the World Economic Forum, which assesses a group of factors and policies that enable the sustainability and flexibility of development in the field of tourism and travel. Egypt ranked 51st in 2021, compared to 83rd in 2015.

According to CNN Travel report, Egypt was chosen among the best tourist destinations to travel to in the Fall 2022.

## I. Suez Canal Economic Zone (SCZone)

In August 2015, H.E. President of the Arab Republic of Egypt issued a decree to establish the General Authority for the Suez Canal Economic Zone, which is the main pillar for economic development in Egypt and a strategic hub for global trade. It encompasses logistical and industrial services according to the highest international standards along the banks of the Canal. SCZONE adopts investor-friendly business environment that will be a cornerstone for national development plans. The conducive business environment SCZONE provides, not only supports new businesses, but also supports existing investors to grow & expand, eventually creating job opportunities and boosting economic development.

### 1 SCZone Description:



There are **5** governorates extending within the Zone: (Port Said – Ismailia – Suez – North Sinai – South Sinai) governorates.



The Zone contains **6** seaports: (East Port Said Port – West Port Said Port – Al Arish Port – Sokhna Port – Al Tor Port – Al Adabiya Port).



It also includes **4** zones: (East Port Said Industrial Zone – Sokhna Industrial Zone – West Qantara Industrial Zone – East Ismailia Industrial Zone).

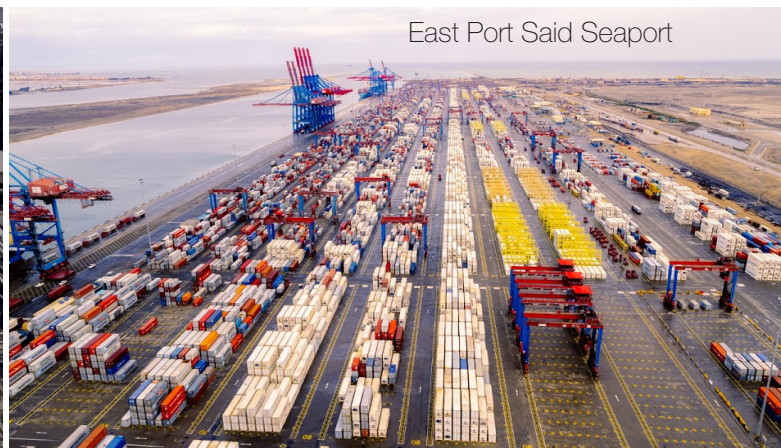

## 2 SCZone Strategy (2020 – 2025):

**SCZone Strategy encompasses nine main objectives, represented in the following:**

-  Create an integrated society based on industry, shipping, maritime transport and logistics services to drive economic development in Egypt, and to become an export center for global markets, especially Africa.
-  Adopt flexible marketing policies to encourage vessels to use the Canal and to attract new customers; such as long-distance discount; permanent reductions of fees; in addition to incentive discount policy for goods.
-  Boost Egypt's plan to localize the priority industry for the purpose of import substitution through integrating small and medium-sized companies into local and global value chains; giving priority to the following industries (vehicles assembly and components, petrochemicals, building and construction materials, textiles and ready-made garments, business, agricultural, food industry, home appliances and electronics, logistics, warehousing, and pharmaceuticals).
-  Adopt integrated industrial clusters policy.
-  Apply a world-class infrastructure in ports and industrial zones.
-  Create platforms for small and medium industries.
-  Capitalize on SCZone's role as a pivotal and global logistics hub amid international supply chains.
-  Develop operation frameworks in ports to attract investments and international shipping lines.
-  Leverage the location of the SCZone and its ports to provide maritime services and bunkering facilities.
-  Establish financial, commercial and service centers.

## 3 Services and industries targeted to be established in the SCZone:

Maritime services and bunkering – casting – building materials and engineering industries – data centers – logistics – agroindustry – solar PV – rolling stock – textile – pharmaceuticals – active pharmaceutical ingredient – automobile tires – chemicals – parts and accessories for motor vehicles (electric vehicle battery).

## 4 SCZone Main Achievements in 2021:

- In 2021, SCZone had the assistance of major international consulting offices in determining the priorities and industries on which the Zone should be based in provide investment opportunities with the investor. SCZone's administration worked on developing its vision according to global markets, their needs and requirement.
- SCZone targeted the regional market, as it joined as a member of the Executive Office of the Organization of African Economic Zones.
- Focus was placed on the localization of petrochemical industries in the Ain Sukhna region with investments amounting to 10 billion dollars within the framework of SCZone strategy (2020-2025), as well as working under the umbrella of the national strategy for the manufacture of cars, as well as the ongoing negotiations to establish green hydrogen industry projects in cooperation with global alliances.
- SCZone signed a contract with the Roads and Bridges Authority to develop the port of Sokhna with investments estimated at 20 billion pounds, with the aim of transforming the Ain Sokhna region into a global platform for investment on the Red Sea due to its importance and a role in integration with the logistical areas and the adjacent industrial area.

## II. New Administrative Capital (NAC)

New Administrative Capital (NAC) project was launched in March 2015. Its aims are to develop Cairo; turn it into a leading political, cultural, and economic center in MENA region while preserving its distinctive historic and majestic properties; and secure a better livelihood there by providing an efficient infrastructure and designed to be a high-tech smart city and a cultural bridge that would be linked to politics, economics and culture in MENA region. The target of Phase (I) of an area of 10.5 thousand feddans is to have a population of five million, in addition to 40 to 50 thousand civil servants transferred to the government agencies new headquarters. It is planned to increase the number of transferred civil servants into 100 thousand after three years.

### 1 Project Description:

- The area of the New Administrative Capital is 170,000 feddans, equivalent to about 714 km<sup>2</sup>. NAC has been divided into several phases:

1

**Phase I:** surface area of about 40 thousand feddans, equivalent to about 161.87 km<sup>2</sup> of the total area of NAC in km.

**Phase II:** surface area of about 47 thousand feddans, equivalent to about 190.2 km<sup>2</sup> of the total area of NAC in km.

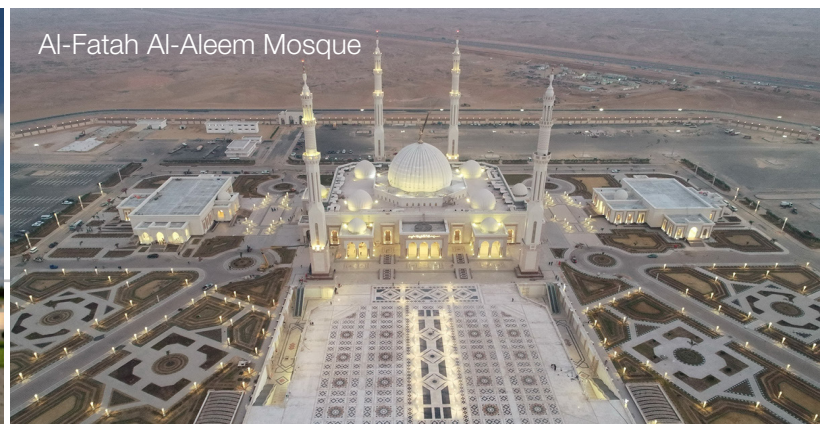

**Phase III:** accommodates about 97 thousand feddans.

- The new administrative capital includes residential neighborhoods, commercial, medical and sports centers, as follows:
  - The residential neighborhood includes 25 residential neighborhoods, about 1.1 million housing units, 40,000 hotel rooms, about 10,000 km of roads, 18 ministerial buildings, and a medical and sports city on an area of 8 km.
  - The Iconic Tower, which is the highest tower in Africa of 400 meters height, with an estimated investment value of USD 3 billion.
  - A large central park called "Capital Park" of a surface area of 1000 Feddans.
  - The Green River spanning over 35 km and being the largest in the world.
  - The electric train that will link 10th of Ramadan and Belbes cities to NAC.
  - 12 commercial malls and two hotels.
  - A new railroad that connects NAC with the national railways network.
  - A power plant with a production capacity of 4,800 MW.
  - It includes Al-Fatah Al-Aleem Mosque, one of the largest mosques in the world, as well as the largest cathedral in the Middle East.

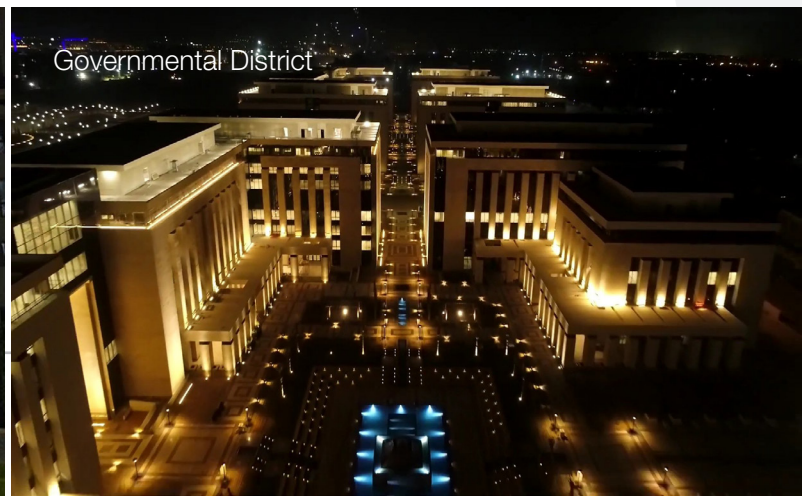

## 2 Project Objectives



**Green City:** Green space per individual will be 15m<sup>2</sup> per capita, which comes in conformity with international quality-of-life standards.



**Connected City:** There will be available means of transportation that meet the different needs of people.



**Sustainable City:** NCA will contain sustainable power and waste-recycling systems, 70% of buildings roofs will be covered by solar panels.

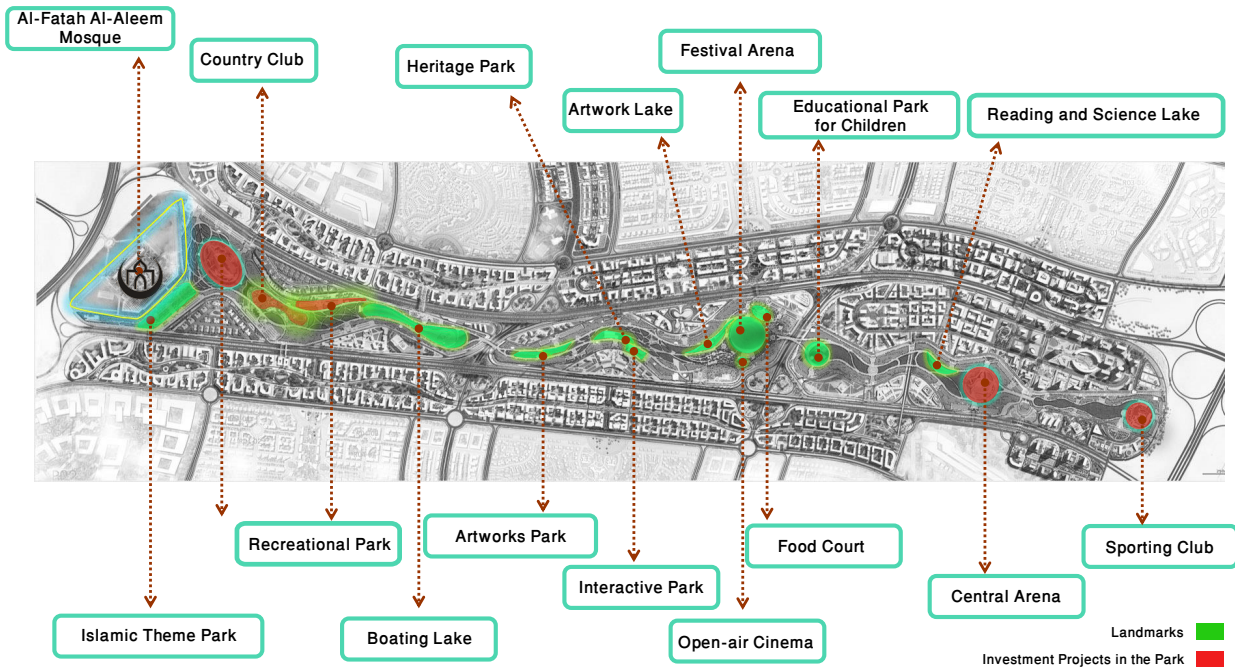

### III. Galala City and Resort Project:

The Galala city development project is one of the most important megaprojects executed along the coast of the Red Sea since October 2015. This project aims to raise an entire city that meets global tourism standards. Galala project is the second most massive project after New Administrative Capital (NAC) in Egypt in terms of constructions and surface area. The city is built on a mountain plateau in front of the shores of the Gulf of Suez. It is divided up into 3 sectors A, B and C. The city is built 700 m above sea level, and it stretches across 17 thousand feddans of land. It encompasses one main road, and numerous roundabouts. It is an integrated and developmental project that is valuable and inspired by the El Galala area, which is known for its geographical distinction and picturesque nature. The Galala project is located in Ain Sukhna at the Galala plateau, starting from the Cairo-Ain Sukhna Road to the top of the plateau in the Wadi Hajul area with a height of 770 meters. The main road of the project starts from the area Wadi Hajoul and linked to the new Beni Suef-Zaafarana Road with a length of 160 km and linking Beni Suef and Zafarana.



#### 1 Project Description:



The project encompasses Galala Marble and Granite Factory Complex, which is divided up into 2 plants over 5 million m<sup>2</sup>; one built over 1 million m<sup>2</sup> and the other over 4 million m<sup>2</sup>.



The project stretches across two zones; one of which is Galala, which is built atop a mountain 700 m above sea level; and the second zone is at the foot of said mountain along the shoreline of the Gulf of Suez. Both zones are connected via an internal road dug into the mountain leaving a marvelous geometrical design.



Three wastewater treatment plants together with a stand-alone power plant have been established to serve the city and the resort through a separate supply line.



The resort has four massive water pumping stations along both sides of the road to pump drinking water up from the desalination plant by the Gulf of Suez down the mountain, to supply Galala city's with drinking water.



The mountain of Galala include three enormous uniquely compounds are designed in the shape of villas overlooking the sea from a soaring height. The villas are ready to be proposed for bidding by investors. Furthermore, a splendid mountainous corniche is designed and built atop the mountain with direct view of the sea. The corniche has fine dining restaurants on both its sides with a spectacular view of both the entire Gulf of Suez and the coast of Sinai Peninsula across the Gulf.



# Galala City and Resort Project



## 2 Main Facilities and Utilities of the Project:



The Galala project includes (a main road, a large lake to collect rainwater, the Galala International City, the Galala International Tourist Resort, the first desalination plant in Egypt and the Middle East, a marble factory, 3 sewage treatment plants, and an independent stand-alone power plant for the city and resort).



The construction and finishing works of the Al-Sahel Hotel at the foot of the mountain have been completed, and it has begun to receive its visitors. The hotel was designed and executed on the latest engineering methods and architectural designs to be a masterpiece and a distinctive sign of the project.



Galala Cable Car is the largest one in the Middle East. It includes two stations, one at the top of the mountain and the other at the foot of the mountain. The length of the cable car track is 4500 m at a height of 665 m above the sea level.



Galala city also has a university above the mountain, which is one of the community universities established by the state to develop university education in line with the needs of the labor market.



Galala City includes 8 cinemas, 2 ice rinks, 624 shops, and a plaza restaurant.



It includes a yacht city that accommodates 333 yachts, in addition to water games (Aqua Park) that includes 73 water games, including 9 games for adults and 10 swimming pools.



It contains 5 hotels, including 2 international hotels, and 3 boutique hotels with the highest level of service.



The city has also government headquarters, hospitals and medical centers operating around the clock, and a special district for business and finance.

## IV. New Alamein City Project

New Alamein City is the first model for a new generation of million cities, which is planned to accommodate more than 4 million people at the end of its first stages. New Alamein is constructed on a surface area of approximately 48 thousand feddans to serve as a model for a comprehensive urban planning strategy aimed at absorbing a large part of the population growth expected in the coming years with the concept of comprehensive and sustainable development. New Alamein City is one of the most important national mega projects in the west of the North Coast. New Alamein City is also known as the second largest city of the fourth generation implemented by Ministry of Housing after NAC, and its target population until 2030 is about 4 million people.

### 1 Project Description:

- The city is located on the North Coast at km. 34 west of Alexandria until the western borders of Egypt and extends more than 60 km along the south of the coastline, and it is 180 km far from Marsa Matrouh. Its location is distinguished by its unique view of the coast of the Mediterranean Sea with a distance of 14 km.
- New Alamein is built on the model of modern global cities, since it is a new model for the Egyptian coastal cities that achieve integrated development and provide a diversified economic basis (tourism, agriculture, industry, trade, and scientific research).
- The first phase of the project is being implemented on a surface area of 14 thousand feddans to accommodate 750 thousand people. The phase also includes the implementation of 15 beach towers with about 4,500 housing units, as well as the construction of 22 thousand housing units of all levels (the downtown area, Latin Neighborhood, premium housing, and Sakan Masr).
- New Alamein is considered the best type of real estate investment in Egypt at present. The total area of hotels is 296 feddans, with 15,500 hotel rooms. It includes the International Medical Center for Healing and Physiotherapy on an area of approximately 45 feddans, and it is implemented on several phases; the first phase of the project is implemented over 400 feddans and includes commercial centers, outlets, exhibitions, amusement parks, a complex of cinemas and theaters, sports clubs, and administrative services.

### 2 Project Objectives:

- The project aims to change the map of the entire North Coast and the concept on which it was established, so that New Alamein becomes a residential city that attracts citizens throughout the year and not only the summer season, as usual.
- The project aims to provide more than **50** thousand job opportunities.
- According to the strategic plan of the City, it is divided into **14** multi-level residential neighborhoods, as well as **5** thousand feddans of industrial areas, **5** thousand feddans of commercial and service areas, **3** thousand feddans of logistics areas, **1000** feddans of research centers and universities, and **260** feddans of the heritage city area. In addition to **20** thousand hotel rooms in the tourist area.

### 3 Project developments:

- Finishing the facades of 15 towers is underway, which has been built in the beach area. Number of other towers are being implemented in the beach area, and construction has been completed in the entertainment area, located in the middle of the beach towers area, overlooking directly on the sea. The towers include a garage that can accommodate 3,000 cars, and a number of shops, and finishing works have been completed on the beach part of the tourist promenade of 7 km long.



# New Alamein City



- The heritage city project is being implemented on an area of 260 feddans, and the total number of facilities in the city is about 70, including (the main lake - the central park - the mosque - the church - the Roman Theater - the opera - commercial and hotel buildings in the old district - the cinema complex". Mazarin Compound, with an area of 700 feddans, is being implemented and includes about 10,000 housing units (buildings - villas - chalets).
- A number of faculties of El Alamein International University of Science and Technology have started in the academic year 2020/2021, namely: Faculty of International Law, Faculty of Engineering 1 and Faculty of Computers. Buildings are provided for Faculty of Engineering, Faculty of Art and Design and Faculty of Graduate Studies and operated in the academic year 2021/2022.
- The implementation of 45 residential buildings (1080 housing units) has been completed in the first phase of the premium housing, and 35 other buildings are being implemented in the second phase which includes 840 housing units, and 4096 housing units (128 residential buildings) are being implemented in "Sakan Misr" project for medium housing. The percentage of accomplishment is 75%.
- A high-speed electric train with a speed of 250 km/hour will be implemented to connect 6th of October City with Alamein City. It is about 221-km-length parallel to Wadi el-Natron – Alamein Rd, and to a fork to Alexandria. It is 99-km-length passing through Burj al-Arab City and Airport, and 244-km-length linking 6th of October City with Alamein City. It is 46-km-length passing through Burj al-Arab City and to a fork to Alexandria

## V. New Mansoura City Project

New City of Mansoura, which mediates the governorates of Dakahlia, Kafr El-Sheikh and Damietta, is one of the new smart cities that the state has begun to construct throughout the Republic. It is considered one of the development pillars on the northern coast of Egypt, as it includes all utilities and services such as government areas, markets, places of worship, cultural and entertainment areas, special areas for restaurants, and central gardens with a coastal view on the Mediterranean Sea, along 15 km. November 2022 witnessed the opening of the first phase of the New City of Mansoura, which is one of the sustainable cities that reflected Egypt's vision in launching the Global Sustainable Cities initiative, where the city contributes to achieving sustainable economic growth and low emissions, improving energy efficiency, encouraging digital transformation, and has the ability to adapt to climate changes. New Mansoura City is located at a length of 14 km on the coastal road in the heart of Dakahlia, next to Gamasa City, as an extension of it to the borders of Kafr El Sheikh Governorate. The city is far from old Mansoura with 54 km. The New Mansoura City will be linked to the old one by constructing an electric train that will connect them in less than 15 minutes.

New Mansoura City is considered one of the distinguished cities in the real estate market in Egypt, and there are many investment opportunities for investors wishing to obtain an excellent real estate opportunity at a reasonable price in the Egyptian real estate market. The city also has many real estate investment advantages that investors are looking for, starting from the distinguished strategic location to services, utilities, prices and other advantages. The city includes different types of housing such as tourist housing, villas, middle housing, and social housing.

The city also includes all the necessary services and utilities that would provide comfort to its residents, which include the following:

- Logistics and service area.
- A regional university.
- A national university affiliated to Mansoura University.
- Scientific research centers.
- Medical city.
- Technological industries zones.
- Corniche on the road with a width of 56 meters.
- A group of public beaches.

### 1 Project Description:

**New Mansoura City is divided into four phases, as follows:**

The first phase: costs EGP 24 billion, and 225 feddans of this phase has been allocated to the private sector, and the first phase of the city represents 40% of the total area (25,000 housing units). The components of the stage are as follows:

- ▶ “Janna” housing project, which includes 11,232 housing units with areas ranging from 120 m2 to 150 m2.
- ▶ Green areas
- ▶ Swimming pools for children inside the residential complexes.





- ▶ “Skan Misr” housing project, which includes 4,704 housing units at a total cost of EGP 1.6 billion, with areas ranging from 106 m<sup>2</sup> to 118 m<sup>2</sup>.
- ▶ Residential villas, which include 2,103 housing units at a total cost of EGP 3.6 billion, with areas ranging from 450 m<sup>2</sup> to 850 m<sup>2</sup>.
- ▶ Social housing, “Skan Misr” housing project for all Egyptians (with coastal nature), which includes 1,392 housing units with areas ranging from 95 m<sup>2</sup> to 100 m<sup>2</sup>.
- ▶ The Corniche and the tourist walkway, with a length of 4.2 km, at a total cost of EGP 600 million, including (pergolas - seating benches - cafeterias - toilets).
- ▶ A central park (beside the coastal road) with a length of 2.4 km, at a total cost of EGP 175 million, including (pedestrian and bicycle paths - seating benches - cafeterias - restaurants).
- ▶ The university complex includes four universities.
- ▶ Medical center at the highest level.



## 2 Project Objectives:

The New Mansoura City is in line with the National Climate Change Strategy as it works to achieve the following goals:

- ▶ Achieving sustainable economic growth and low emissions
- ▶ Improved energy efficiency
- ▶ Encouraging digital transformation
- ▶ Adapting to climate changes, as it is one of the sustainable cities that formed Egypt's vision in launching the global Sustainable Cities Initiative in cooperation with the United Nations Development Program at the recent 27th Conference of the Parties (COP 27)
- ▶ Pedestrian and bicycle friendly as well as supporting mass and sustainable transportation, as well as supporting water reuse.
- ▶ The city provides open beaches for all Egyptian families, and ceremonial squares for entertainment in the Corniche of “Ahl Misr”, in addition to the presence of many activities in the outdoor and open areas, as the city includes 1800 feddans of green areas.
- ▶ A regional service center at the level of the Delta region, as it contains 4 universities (New Mansoura University, Mansoura International University, Mansoura National University, and Mansoura Technology), which are regional services provided by the new city to the residents of the Delta.



## VI. Damietta Furniture City Project

The furniture city in Damietta is one of the most important national projects and one of a series of new cities specialized in strategic industries. It is the first and largest industrial zone specialized in the manufacture of furniture and complementary industries in the Middle East and the African continent. The furniture manufactured in Egypt, especially in Damietta, is known by its high quality, which opens the door for exporting Damietta furniture at the local, regional and global levels. The project is located in Shatta, Damietta, on an area of 331 feddans, at the intersection of the international coastal road with Port Said / Damietta road. The city includes all the requirements of the furniture industry, such as various factories and workshops for the furniture industry, complementary industries, service centers, and administrative and investment areas.

Damietta Furniture City encompasses 54 hangars that include 1348 factories, workshops, a furniture technology hub, and five service centers, including central workshops to serve small manufacturers, shops, administrative offices, a bank, a police station, a fire station, and a medical clinic.

### 1 Project Description:

- ▶ The city has 21 main locations including small and medium-sized workshops, exhibitions and technology centers.
- ▶ The industrial area includes 2400 small and medium-sized workshops.
- ▶ The city includes 75 specialized factories with an area ranging from 1,000 square meters to 10,000 square meters.
- ▶ Small workshops ranging from 100-150 square meters.
- ▶ The area of the first factory is 2550 square meters, which will be divided into 24 workshops for small furniture makers.
- ▶ Medium and small workshops on an area of 72.15 feddans.
- ▶ Large factories located on an area of 49.49 feddans.
- ▶ Exhibition complex on an area of 20.94 feddans.
- ▶ Complementary industries complex on an area of 9.76 feddans, such as adhesives, paints, sponges, and accessories needed for the industry.
- ▶ The government services complex is located on an area of 4.62 feddans.
- ▶ The administrative complex is built on an area of 4.23 feddans.
- ▶ Total of 35 feddans are allocated for the Damietta Furniture Sanitation Project.





## 2 Project goals

- ▶ Develop the export capacity of the furniture industry sector, especially with the advantages of location and proximity to the export ports (Damietta / Port Said), and the main consumption markets, to reach one billion dollars annually as proceeds from exports.
- ▶ Maximize the comparative advantage of specialized industries in general and the furniture industry in particular by enhancing technology in the furniture industry.
- ▶ Develop the furniture industries to increase the added value to the industry in Egypt.
- ▶ Optimize the economic potential of Damietta Governorate.
- ▶ Enhance the contribution of the industrial sector in general and the furniture sector in particular to the development of north Delta region.
- ▶ Provide new job opportunities that contribute to solving the unemployment problem in the Delta and northern governorates of Egypt.
- ▶ Diversify the economic structure of the governorate to improve the standard of living and raise the level of low-income people.
- ▶ Provide a regional marketing hub serving the local furniture market.
- ▶ Preserve the environment and public health by urging many of the owners of workshops that are located within the residential blocks in Damietta to move to an area designated for the furniture industry.
- ▶ Contribute to the establishment of small and medium projects complementary to the furniture industry to provide production requirements.
- ▶ Provide raw materials at reasonable prices due to locating production centers to sell supplies near the manufacturing workshops, which saves transportation costs.





## VII. Robiki Leather City Project

Al- Robbiki is one of the most important specialized industrial cities designed according to the latest international standards, and it is the first integrated industrial complex specializing in leather industries with local and foreign investments in the Middle East. The city is built on a total area of 1,629 feddans at a cost of EGP 2.7 billion, and it specializes in the leather tanning industry. The zone of tanneries located on Magra El-Oyoun Wall in Old Cairo was moved to it.

“Al- Robbiki” project is one of the most prominent major projects that took place during the past eight years. It is considered an integrated industrial city for the leather and textile industry, and it is the largest industrial city in the Middle East. It was inaugurated by President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi in July 2020, and its main objective is to make Egypt a strategic center for the leather industry, not only at the local or regional level, but also at the international level. The establishment of Al- Robbiki City aims to create an integrated system with the latest international technology in the field of leather tanning, with a commitment to maintaining the general shape of the city, avoiding randomness in construction and reducing the negative environmental effects resulting from the nature of production in the field of leather tanning. The area of Al- Robbiki city is about 490 feddans, and the new industrial complex in Al- Robbiki includes 6 factories: a fine spinning factory, a thick spinning factory, 3 factories for preparing weaving and for circular and rectangular weaving, and a factory for dyeing and printing. The factories are equipped with the latest machines that operate according to the latest technological systems and programs.

### 1 Project Description:

- 

The city is divided into a "productive units and auxiliary services" zone on an area of 511 feddans. During the last period, Ministry of Commerce and Industry completed the first phase of the project with a total of 213 production units for 195 investors on an area of 176 feddans. Utilities have been introduced to 69 feddans in the second phase of the project.
- 

The industrial wastewater treatment plants zone includes the sanitary landfill zone on an area of 282 feddans, and EGP 200 million has been allocated to rehabilitate it and accommodate future expansions, in addition to the tree forest zone on an area of 280 feddans, which will be irrigated with wastewater after treatment.
- 

The city includes Leather Tanning Technology Centre (LTTC) on an area of 6000 square meters in cooperation with the Italian side, as well as integrated industries (tanneries, gelatin and glue factories, warehouses, chemicals, and stores).
- 

Establishment of a heritage museum dedicated to showing the stages of development of the leather industry in Egypt.
- 

The city contains public service centers such as banks, conference halls, exhibitions, maintenance centers, shopping outlets, licensing offices, a hospital, a fire station, a police station, and a communications center.





## 2 Project Key Indicators:

- The annual industrial growth rate in the leather sector is about 7%.
- The volume of industrial investments in the city is about EGP 2.5 billion.
- The city's annual production rate is about 150 million square feet.
- The daily production volume for each worker in the city is about 50 square feet.
- The volume of industrial exports annually ranges from 100 to \$150 million.
- The production of AI- Robbiki Leather City increases by 40% over the production of Magra El- Oyouun so far.
- The cost of machinery and equipment specialized in the tanning industry in the city is about EGP 1 billion.
- The third phase of the project accommodates from 100 to 150 factories of leather products.
- The volume of direct job opportunities in the city is about 10,000 job opportunities and 25,000 indirect job opportunities by completing the project phases.
- A contract was signed with the largest international leather exhibition "APLF", which has been held for 36 years in Hong Kong, and is visited by about 60,000 visitors annually to organize the exhibition in the Middle East and Africa in Cairo under the name of Robbiki Leather City, which will be held annually.



## 3 Project Objectives:

- Egypt regained its pioneering role in the industry for which Cairo has been famous for more than 1,000 years.
- The city has a modern infrastructure that overcomes all the environmental problems that were facing the tanneries of the ancient Magra El-Oyouun zone.
- The project aims to increase leather tanning production from 125 million square feet semi-finished to 350 million square feet fully finished annually, and increase the added value by completing the finishing stages, especially since 85% of the current exports of leather are unfinished.
- A study is currently being conducted to allocate 800 feddans next to AI- Robbiki Leather City to transfer approximately 17,600 workshops producing leather goods established in slums all over the state, including 13,400 workshops in AI-Muski and Bab Al-Sharia, with the aim of gathering them in one place in implementation of the directives of the political leadership in eliminating slums in residential areas.



## VIII. New Delta Project

The Egyptian State gives the portfolio of investment in the agricultural sector and land reclamation a top priority, which is reflected in the New Delta Project, which was launched by H.E. President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi at the end of 2021. It is an exemplary and integrated development project of strategic importance to achieve food security for the Egyptian people. It encompasses the formation and establishment of new agricultural and urban societies characterized by modern management systems that have industrial complexes based on agricultural production and provide thousands of new job opportunities for young people and investors; which contributes to the protection and achievement of food security for Egypt, the provision of strategic commodities, as well as stabilizing commodity prices in the markets, and supporting the State's ability to cope with population growth.

The area of the development project is about 2.2 million feddans, and the cultivation of one million feddans is scheduled to be completed within two years, and would be suitable for growing all kinds of crops. The project is in the western northern coast in Dabaa axis area. The project accommodates the population increase in the Delta and the Valley, and enhances the State's strategy in the field of establishing new agricultural communities with modern administrative systems. It is characterized by its strategic location near ports and airports, including Alexandria Port, Sokhna Port, Damietta Port, and west of Cairo and Borg Al Arab Airports, and is linked to main roads and an existing urban network and new ones, including Sadat City, Sphinx and the 6th of October.

### 1 Project Description:

The New Delta project includes the Mustaqbal Misr, and south of Dabaa axis projects, as follows:

#### A. "Mustaqbal Misr" Project:

- The project is located along the new Rod El Farag – Dabaa axis road, which is the road that was established within the National Road Project and is 30 minutes away from 6th of October City. The project area is 500 thousand feddans.
- Cultivation of an area of 200 thousand feddans has been completed through using the available groundwater in the area. It is expected to reach 350 thousand feddans by the beginning of 2022, using 1,600 developed pivot irrigation devices to be planted twice annually (in the summer and winter seasons) where it produces the finest agricultural crops with a total investment of EGP 5 billion.

#### B. Reclamation 500 thousand feddans in the south of Dabaa axis Project:

- The project will be located in the south of Dabaa axis, west of the Mustaqbal Misr project, near the old Delta and the road network and ports, whether sea, land or air. It links the administrative borders of the governorates of Marsa Matrouh, Beheira and Giza. The project area is about 500 thousand feddans.
- An inventory was conducted to an area of 688 thousand feddans west of the Mustaqbal Misr Project, and after the study it became clear that more than 90% of the area is suitable for cultivation of strategic crops, amounting to 500 thousand feddans, on top of which are wheat, maize, legumes, vegetable crops and various types of fruits, and a giant plant will be established with a capacity of 6 million m<sup>3</sup> / day to treat agricultural wastewater for further exploitation.





## 2 Project Objectives:



Achievement of food security for Egypt, limitation of the import of strategic commodities, and meeting of the requirements of the population increase in food commodities.



Adding 30% of new agricultural areas from the net lands of the old Delta.



Provision of activities related to agriculture, such as livestock and poultry activities and agricultural processing.



The entire project is based on the use of modern irrigation systems.



It includes industrial societies based on agricultural production.



Contribution to the provision of thousands of job opportunities for the youth.



Compensation for the loss of agricultural land due to unfair construction.





## VII. Toshka Project Reviving

The Egyptian Sate has taken care of many national issues including the food security portfolio, which received great attention, as Egypt launched several national agricultural projects, including the launch of the 1.5 million Feddans Project, the New Delta, and the revival of the Toshka Al-Khair Project. The revitalization of the Toshka project is one of the most important projects being implemented in the agricultural sector, as it has the largest dates farm in the Middle East in terms of the number of palms and the best types of dates such as Medjool and Barhi. In addition to the areas planted with strategic crops, such as wheat, vegetables, citrus, and mango. Experiences have shown that productivity in the Toshka region is high and we are promising to achieve good and positive results.

### 1 Project Description:

- The project was launched in January 1997, and did not achieve the desired results and objectives until the decision of President Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi in 2014 to revive the Toshka project within the state's plan to launch a number of major projects, in implementation of his program to reclaim one million feddans within the national plan to reclaim **4** million feddans within 4 years.
- The project contributed to the development of Abu Simbel city, where its population increased from about 2000 to 21 thousand people currently, as well as the development of Abu Simbel port, increasing means of transportation and ease of transportation between Aswan and Abu Simbel. Cultivation of **18,000** feddans were carried out around Khor Toshka, and the number of hospitals increased from one to three hospitals, and handicraft workshops from 4 to **40** workshops, in addition to many restaurants and banks, which allowed the provision of **17,000** additional job opportunities.

### 2 The Importance of the Project:

- The project is located in the Toshka area, about 225 km south of Aswan, which is located on a surface area of **485,000** feddans. It aims to achieve self-sufficiency in some strategic crops, including wheat, where 30,000 feddans of wheat were planted during the first 3 months from the beginning of the first phase. About 100,000 feddans are ready for cultivation, and another 100,000 feddans are being prepared during the coming period. Canals with a total length of 19.8 km have been dug and lined, 18.2 km long canals are being excavated, and 52 pump stations have been established, comprising 219 pumps to pump water for center pivot irrigation systems. The construction of 47 other stations is underway that comprise 239 pumps, so the number of stations will be 99 stations comprising 458 pumps. In addition, the pipelines of irrigation networks crossings and the feeding canal were implemented with 11 crossing paths.



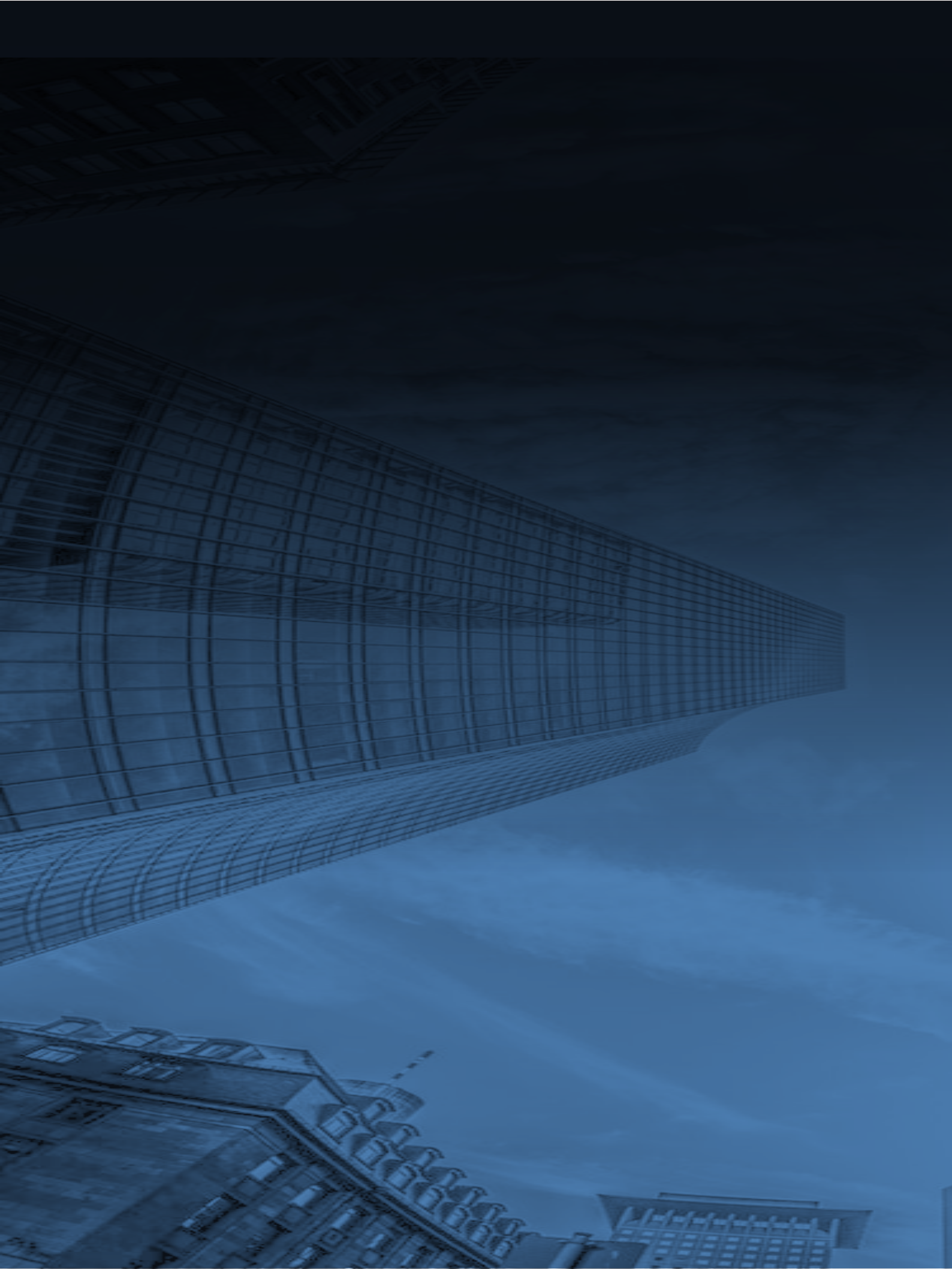


### 3 Project Objectives:

- Toshka project aims to provide new urban communities, as the majority of its employees are from Upper Egypt. It also has a research station affiliated to the Desert Research Center and another affiliated to the Agricultural Research Center, as well as agriculture automation station.
- Ministry of Agriculture has carefully selected the areas of the reclamation plan of one million feddans in Toshka, which is divided into :
  - Toshka project on **108,000** feddans
  - Toshka wells on **30,000** feddans
  - Old Farafra on **200,000** feddans
  - New Farafra on **100,000** feddans
  - Dakhla on **50,000** feddans
  - Extension of East Oweinat on **50,000** feddans
  - South of Qattara Depression on **50,000** feddans
  - West Minya project on **200,000** feddans
  - Al Maghra area on **150,000** feddans
  - East Siwa on **30,000** feddans.

The project of reclamation of one million feddans depends by **90%** on groundwater. Ministry of Irrigation has begun digging water wells, and there are **50** solar-powered wells in the project to serve the new lands and the development process in the area.

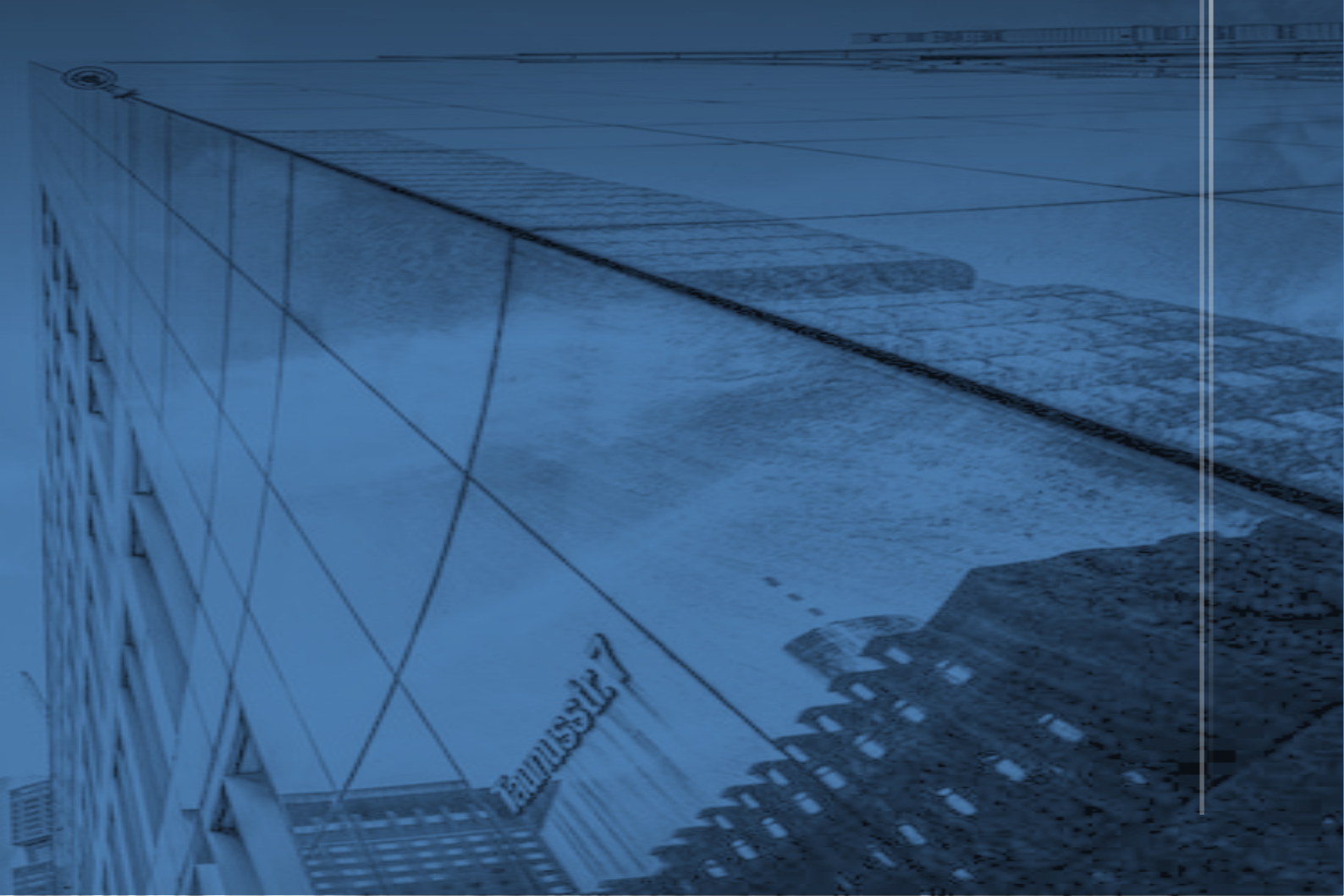
